THE FAMINE IN INDIA.

Sad Tales of Destitution from the Stricken Districts.

FOOD SUPPLY NEARLY EXHAUSTED

The Minimum Date of Food Given to the Starving People Only Sufficient to Keep Body and Soul Together, and Too Little to Bulld Up the System.

LONDON, Feb. 8 - William Lord Sands LONDON, Feb. 8 — William Lord Sang-hursh, governor of Bombay, has sont a cable message to the effect that the bu-bonic plague patients patronias the hos-pitals more freely than at the time of the first outbreak of the epidemic. In the sec-tion where the disease has its strongest hold in the beginning it is now being sup ps\_sed, but it appears to be extending to new portions of the Bombay presidency. In places most recently infected by the plague the mortality is evidently not as great. In the city of Bombay the num-ber of deaths diminished during the week ending Jau. 20, and the feeling at that place is one of great hopefulness. In the city of Poonah, Bombay presidency, fifty-eight cases were reported, but a late acsight cases were reported, but a late account is to the effect that forty-sight cases were announced in a single quarter

of the town. Governor Sandhurst reports that the number of deaths from the plague at Karachi ranched 208 for the week ending Jan. 22, diminishing to 178 for the week ending Jan. 29, decreasing in the two worst quarters of the town, but increasing in the two omic. It is estimated that one-fourth of the total population of the city has left Karachi on account of the plague. The only deaths from plague reported from Sind, just outside, Karachi, are said to be those of travelers. Generally speaking this same thing may be said to be true of other towns of the Hombay presidency besides the cities of Bombay and Poonah, with the exception, however, of the towns of Bandors and Courle, and their suburban villages, and the unhealthy place of Bhi-

wandi, in the Thane district.
