The consuls returned to Sellnos, where the Christians occupied fresh positions, Here, also, the consuls were fired upon the shots falling all around the ship. Finally they met the insurgent leaders at Sellnos, where they proposed an armistice of one week. This proposition was accepted by both Mussul-

mans and Christians.




