SANGUILLY'S GREETING

The Liberated Cuban Arrives Safely at Key West.

HIS GRATITUDE TO GENERAL LEE.

Both Sangully and his wife speak in glowing terms of our Consul General, Sangully will march in a position of honor in the inaugural parade.

Key West, Fla., March 1.—General Julio Sangully has arrived from Havana by the steamer Mascoite. He was at first indisposed to say anything further than what would express his everlasting gratitude to General General Philip Thomas Lee, who he described as a truly noble American, and a man who should long ago have been in Cuba.

Asked how he was treated during his confinement he beamed earnestly not to be compelled to recall his terrible experience during the last two years.

"Why," said he, "I have not been allowed to read one solitary newspaper except those published on the island. When I heard of the death of brave General Mascoite it almost made me insane, but because I thought the death of any one man could check the progress of the Cuban cause, but because I know that the butcher Weyler would try to pacify the people by pointing to Mascoite's death as a great victory for the government."

Asked about his plans for the future, General Sangully said: "I do not know that myself, but I am now going to Washington to attend the inaugural parade, having been invited by the old soldiers boys to parade with them. I have been given a place of honor in the parade. After that I shall go to New York to see my brother, who has worked so valiantly for his release, and then I shall keep my promise to the people of Key West to return and bring them a visit, as I am always happy to see my fellow countrymen."

General Sangully's wife was equally fond in her praise of Consul General Lee.

"He is the best of men," she said. "No noble, firm in his convictions and true to his word owe the final release of our dear husband, who has been confined in a damp dungeon for the past two years on trumped up charges, entirely unsupported by any proofs."

"We have a general there who is causing devastation and ruin to the whole island simply because he now sees that it is lost to Spain, and that the Cubans will win in spite of all opposition Spain can offer."

"With honor, General Sangully gave three ringing cheers for Cuba Libre."

A deputation met General Sangully at the wharf. He was discovered and pointed out by the crowd the moment the steamer reached the dock. The throng in waiting shouted "Viva Julio Sangully," "Viva Consul General Lee," "Viva Cuba Libre," "Viva Los Estados Unidos."

"Sangully was escorted with his family to El Polonio restaurant where he dined. The restaurant was crowded with his friends and countrymen, eager to have a word with him and to embrace him. When questioned by a friend as to the competitor's crew he replied earnestly: "If the United States government did not take prompt and energetic action to secure their release he feared the worst would befall them."
