the Lawmakers' Time. Washington, May 17,-The proceed-ngs in the senate this week are by no

means settled. All will depend upon the course the Cuban question may take. Senator Morgan's joint resolu-tion occupies the favored place on the talendar, and there is fittle doubt that it will be taken up at the appointed your today. Still there is a slight pos-slidility that the expected message of the president may cause a postpone-ment, and that the character of his recommendations may have a bearing that will influence the tenor of the resolution that ultimately will be adop-The Alabama senator will not stand in the way of action in accordance with such a recommendation as the president may make upon this i, but he will insist that it shall be independent of and that it shall in no wise interfere with his resolution providing for recognition of Cuban belligerency.

The house leadors have not yet decided upon the methods by which they will make their response to the president's message, which will be sent to congress today or tomorrow, asking for relief for the starving Americans in Cuba. That the response will be quick and complete, however, there is no reason to doubt. In the present condition of affairs in the house three methods of proceedure are open. Ordinarily the message would go to the committee on foreign affairs for consideration, and that committee would report a bill which would come back to the house for action through the regular channels. The speaker could in the present emergency simply appoint this committee and let the w ubject take the regular course, But t is hardly likely that this will be done The subject is so well understood that i probably will be thought that the nembers, with the measure and the accompanying documents which the president will transmit before them, an act intelligently without a committee report.




