ECCENTRIC MILLIONAIRE DEAD. He Lived For Years in a House Only

Five Fort Wide. New York, June 9, Joseph Richardson, an ecsentric millionaire, died here yesterday. He made his fortune in ratiread building, and was closic asso-clated with the Vanderbilts and Goulds. He constructed large sections of the Union Pacific, Missouri Pacific, Iron Mountain and Mexican Central railroads. He came as a poor boy from England, Mr. Richardson's fortune has been estimated at \$30,000,000.

In many ways the dead millionaire was so eccentric as to excite public comment, although his chief aversion was seeing his name in print. He dressed more like a tramp than a wealthy man, and lived and died in a house which was only five feet wide. This place has been called the "Spite" house. It was built because the sur-rounding property owners refused to meet Richardson's terms for the nar-row lot: He afterwards refused fabulous sums for the little piece of ground on which his house stood, amid the tall houses on the best part of Lexington
