

Serious Trouble on the Northern Frontier of India. ATIACKED BY HOSTILE NATIVES

> Twenty-Eight Soldiers Killed and as Many Wounded-The Mullah of Powininh Belleved to Be Responsible for the Attack on the Britons.

> Bombay, June 12 .-- A dispatch received here from Simia, the residence of the Indian government officials during the heated periods of the year, announces serious trouble on the dorth-ern frontier and the mnassacre of a number of British officers and native soldiers in the government employ. From the particulars obtainable at present it seems that two guns belonging to a Bonihay mounted battery, es-corted by any men belonging to the First regiment of Sikhs and to the First Punjab infautry, were treacher-ously attacked in the Tochi valley by a large force of bostile natives. The first report sold that Colonel Bunny, two officers and 25 privates had been killed and that three officers and 25 men had been wounded. In addition numbers of number and horses are re-

Indications are that the affair is more than a more conflict with war-like natives, and that the notorious Mullah of Powindal is at the bottom of the treuble. The latest advices are that a political officer, Mr. McGee, was visiting Shivani with an escori of troops when he was attacked at Maiza by vastly superior forces. The British troops were compelled to retreat, and were followed for neveral miles by overwhelming numbers of the enemy. The fighting was desperate. All the Dritish officers were severely wounded. Captain Browne, of the First Sikhs, a on of the inte Sir James Browne, and Eleutenant Crookshank, of the Royal Artillery, were killed, and Surgeon Higgington, of the First Sikhs, and Lieutenant Seaton-Browne, of the Punjab infanity, were wounded. tion the death of Colonel Bunny, but from the fact that it says that Colone Gray, from Miranshah, has taken over the command of the British force engaged it is inferred that Colonel Bunny s also among the dead, as at first an

Tochi valley lies north of Gumal and on the road to Ghuani and Wastriatan. It has been controlled by the British since the delimitation of the indo Afghan frontier, but the tribes ther have always been turbulent, and anxsety is felt lest the other tribes rise against the British.

The Mulinh of Powindah is well known to the British Indian authoritles. He is a notorious fanatical priest and has always been hostile to British influence. Owing to an attempt which the mullah recently made to stir up a rebeilion he was expelled from Britlah territory. This caused him to be de-perted by his own people, and he has since lived in Afghanistan, and is understood to have been actively plotting against the British. He took part in the attack upon the British camp at Wano in November, 1894.






