European Governments Tire of Turkey's Dilatory Tactics.

PORTUGAL'S NOTE TO THE PORTS

Unless Turkey Appoints a Day to Discuss the Strategic Frontier the Ambassadors Will Request Their Governments to Adopt Energetic Measures.

London, July 8.—Eastern affairs show little change during the last 24 hours. A sensational newspaper in Paris published a rumor yesterday that M. Hanotaux, minister of foreign affairs, had informed the cabinet that matters in the east were very serious, and that Admiral Bernard, the minister of marine, had instructed the admiral in command of the Mediterranean fleet to mobilize his forces with a view of making a naval demonstration in the Bosphorus, but this is regarded as unnecessarily alarmist.

More to the purpose is the fact that Austria-Hungary has presented a note to the Porte asking that unless the Turkish government appoints a day for the Turkish military commissioner to discuss with the European attaches the strategic frontier proposed by Europe the ambassadors will request their respective governments to adopt energetic measures.

According to the best information obtainable this strategic frontier would give Turkey about 250 square kilometers of territory in the district of Metsovo and some villages in the Tynavos district. The indemnity would be \$4,500,000, Turkish, £1,500,000 to be paid on the departure of the Turks from Thessaly, and an equal amount in the course of a year. A Franco-English company raising the money by farming the Greek customs. These concessions are made with a view of enabling the sultan to overcome the objections of the war party.

It is the general belief that the negotiations are likely until the end of the year, when winter will compel Turkey to withdraw her troops from Thessaly. Just now, while the weather is good and food abundant, it is comparatively easy to keep them there. An imperial order has been issued to the commandant of the Dardanelles to prepare for the sailing of the Turkish fleet under special orders.
