Millions of Dollars Arrangements are being made for a big labor meeting in McKeesport on Saturday evening, which all the striking miners in the Turtle Creek and Monongahela valleys are expected to attend. The speakers engaged are Samuel P. Gompers, president of the American Pederation of Labor; M. P. Ratch-ford, president of the United Mine Workers, and M. M. Garland, president of the Amalgamated Association The strikers expect great results from this meeting.

In order to get the men out again the strikers will make daily marches from Camp Victory until they regain lost ground. The striking miners who were former employes of the New York and Cleveland Gas Coal company met yesterday afternoon, formed a permanent organization and appointed a com-mittee from each mine to take charge of the strike at those mines. Follow ing the organization they attended a meeting at Turtle Creek addressed by Mrs. Jones, of Chicago, at which 3,000 miners and their wives were present from the different sections of the dis-

The first meeting held by the strikers at Irwin yesterday was poorly attended by the miners of that district, as all were at work. Marchers to the number of about 1,000 came to the meeting from Shaners, Suterville and other parts of this district. The strikers probest endeavors to get the men out.

## DERVISHES ROUTED.

The Capture of Abu Hamed by the British Forces,

AFTER A HAND TO HAND FIGHT.

The Total British Loss Was Twentyone Killed and Sixty-one Wounded. Among the Dead Being Two British Cairo, Aug. 12 .- Official dispatches

Assouan, on the Nile near the First Cataract, gives details of the capture of Abu Hamed on Aug. 7 by the Anglo-Egyptian troops under Colonel Hunter, after an 18 hours' march from Colonel Hunter kept all his prepara-

tions for the attack a strict secret, in order to prevent the spies of the khalifa in the Soudan from getting wind of his plans. He declined to allow any newspaper correspondents to accompany the columns to the front. After enrrying the high ground over-looking the town the Anglo-Egyptian troops advanced to the attack upon the village. A stubborn house to house

fight ensued, and Colonel Hunter was obliged to bring up the artillery before it was possible to carry the po-The total British loss was 21 killed and 61 wounded, of whom the Tenth Soudanse batallion lost 14 killed, among them British officers, and 24 wounded. Mafor H. M. Stdney fell mortally wounded while leading his men to the attack.

and died in five minutes. Lieutenant Fliz Clarence was shot almost at the same moment through the heart. Three Egyptian officers received severe gun-Colonel Hunter in his dispatches, highly praises the stendiness and dash of the troops throughout the engagement. The village is a network of crowded houses and twisting, narrow

alleys, so that most of the fighting was The dervishes repeatedly charged through the narrow streets. Finally their cavalry, having lost over half their number, fled precipitately, followed by about 100 infantry. These were all that escaped. The dervish com-mander, Mahommed Zein, was captured. Another well known emir stub-bornly defended himself, with his followers, in a strongly fortified house, and was only killed at last when the

house was destroyed by the artillery.

A large number of prisoners, arms, standards, camels and horses, other property, were taken. The Nile at Merawi is in a most unpleasant state from the corpses floating down. The inhabitants, as during the advance of the Dongola expedition, have shown every kind of rejoicing at their deliverance from dervish oppresions.

The garrison at Abu Hamed has been much increased since the khallfa's defeat of the Janlin tribe and the cap-ture of Metemnen by his forces. On the other hand, Colonel Hunter's troops were assisted in capturing the town by some friendly Arabs from Murad.
At present the general situation is

The khalifa continues to reinforce the army of occupation at Meternneh under Mahmoud. Both sides of the river have been fortified. Mahmoud re-cently sent reinforcements to Berber but recalled them on hearing of the advance by Colonel Hunter upon Abu Hamed. He now threatened to advance on Jakdul, a village held by friendly Arabs, but it is expected that the ar-rival of the gunboats at Abu Hamed shortly will prevent him from leaving Metemneh with any considerable force.


