Chicago, Aug. 25.—The Timberman gives the following summary of the year's lumber exports from all the United States ports: The quantity of our exports of forest

products for the year ording June 30, 1897, as compared for those of the year ending June 20, 1887, shows in increase of slightly over 100 per cent, and, as compared with the average for the five years beginning June 30, 1986, es an increase of a fraction less than 60 per cent.

The total value of our exports of domestic forest and lumber products for the year ending June 30, 1897, as compared with the previous 12 months. was \$39,624,899, against \$31,947,108, or an Increase of over 24 per cent.

Our lumber experts to the United Kinkdom for the years ending June 20, 1896 and 1897, were: 1896, \$7,920.458; 1897, \$11,530,6663.
