THE UPRISING IN INDIA.

The Situation on the Frontier Growing More Serious.

HOSTILE TRIBES STRENGTHENING

the Re-Conquest of the Khyber Pass, Which Has Fallen Into the Hands of of the Afridis, Will Be a Formidable Task For British Troops.

Bombay, Aug. 26.—The latest dis-patches received from the front indi-cate that the situation on the frontier is getting worse. It is evident that the Indian government must face a grave crists, involving heavy expenditure and probably great loss of life.

The government is confronted with pass has fallen into the hands of the Afridis; the posts in Kurram valley are threatened by the powerful tribe of the Orakzals; the Mohmand tribesmen are meditating a renewal of hostilities around Fort Shabkadr, while thousands of troops are engaged in crushing the revolt in the Swat valley, and two large brigades are holding the Tochi valley, where the Mahsud-Wazcys are

The authorities are convinced that Fort All-Musjid could only have fallen after desperate fighting, and the native Opposite Reading rati o detailoners, was made up of men who rendered valuable assistance in the Black mountain expedition of 1888. The fall of the fort is a very serious blow, for it isolates Fort Landi-Rotal, which is at the extreme end of Khyber pass, garrisoned by 200 Khyber rifles, and necessitates

the prompt re-conquest of the pass.

This is certain to prove a formidable task, of which the British troops had a foretaste on Monday, when a body of artillery, cavairy and infantry left Fort Bara, south of the Peshawar, in color to the Artilla who were order to repel the Afridia, who were then advancing down the Bazai vail durable and cheap. ley. The troops returned early Tues-day morning and reported that many of them had dropped out from want of water, none being procurable along the route, while the Afridis, although shelled by the British, maintained their position on the heights, threatening the loyal villages of Kadam and the

British position, Fort Jamrud, at the mouth of the pass.

Fort Jamrud is held by a strong force of British and native troops, and the British front extends about 35 miles from Shabkadr along the north side of the Cabul river and southward to Peshawar, where the troops are massing as a base of demonstration against the Orakrais, who occupy the region south of the Afridis, but have not yet assumed the belligerent proportions of their northern neighbors. There is an uprising, however, of small parties, which is proving troublesome near Kohai, and it is expected that both tribes will try to close the Kohai pass. Numbers of tribesmen are moving up towards Khyber from Kohal and that district, making the salt tariff the pretext for hostilities.

The wildest excitement prevails among the Hindoo traders at Banu, on Kurram river, It is rumored that 7,000 Waxiers intended to swoop down there, sack the town and massacre the inhabitants. The mulla and his emissaries, especially those from the Afghan governor of Khost, are activeis stirring up the Wazeys, who are also affected by the disloyal attitude of the Kurrum tribes and emboldened by the knowledge that the garrison at

Banu is very weak. There is one ground for satisfaction in the fact that, except in a few in-stances, the Afridi levies remain loyal n the face of temptation to join their namen, as was conspicuously the case

at Fort Maude. Far more hopeful intelligence comes from the Swat valley, where the Bonerwala have opened peace negotia tions. The authorities expect that this recent fighting than has been sup-



from Alaska yesterday, carrying as passengers J. W. Virgin, J. H. Webber, W. H. Hockaday, C. H. J. Wissman, A. Bell and Arthur Needham. The Willamette left Skaguay Thursday, Aug 19, Juneau Friday, and Sitka Satur day morning. She brought down no gold, although \$30,000 was offered by a party of four men who had enessed overland from Dawson City, leaving there Sunday, July 4, These men, however, only wanted to come as far a Juneau, where they expected to winter, and as the purser was not sure at the time the gold was offered that the boat would stop at Juneau he de-clined to take it on board. They reported that provisions at Dawson are growing very short. One of them said that he had a friend who had several buckets of gold, but was living on two spoonfuls of beans and a piece of bacon as large as his hand per day. The officers of the Willamette emwas put in from on the up trip. The story originated, they say, from the fact that a refractory stowaway from Tacoma was put in irons between Seattle and Tacoma before the boat left for Skaguay.

Thomas Stanton, of Scattle, was on of the returning passengers of the steamer. He went north to join a Scattle party that left on the Mexico. The others had taken his outfit with them, and he proposed to meet them on the trail. The steamer was so much delayed in starting that Stanton ar-rived too late, and decided to was until spring before going to the Yukon He says:

"It is a shame the way the Skagus. trail has been advertised, as every day proves it to be more and more imprac-ticable. I went over the trail as far as Porcupine river, and that was all I wanted, although I did not have a pack to speak of. Dead horses can be seen all along the trail, while many others are so badly skinned up and bruise that they are fit for nothing. Foot-sore men and others with strained backs are common, especially among the men who went up with the intention of packing for wages. The bigges crowd of prospective Klondikers is t be found camped along the trail all the way from the bay to the summit. hink very few men will get through

"Over at Dyea there seems to be very little trouble. The trail is much steeper but horses do not get up to their necks in mud and slush. Many men are going over to go the other way. Things are very lively at the town and on the bay just now. At first it was all tents but frame buildings are rapidly going up, Next week a sawmill will be in operation. Men are already at work getting out lumber for the new mill at good wages. Six stores carrying stocks of mixed goods have started up.

The White pass, in its present crude condition, is practicable for the entire distance to Lake-Bennett, and a man without a pack can go over it in 24 hours. Pack and mals can traverse it with a load of 150 pounds, and it seems to be the better trail for those who have brought horses


