LOST IN ARCTIC ICE

Twenty-nine Whalers Have Probably Met Their Death.

THE ESCAPE OF EIGHT OTHERS.

After Great Hardships the Little Party, including the Captain's Wife, Worked Their Way to a Desolate Island, From Which They Were Rescued. Seattle, Wash., Sept. 15.—Captain Joseph Whitfield, of the whaler Nevech, lost in the Arctic, together with 35 of her crew, came down on the steamer Humboldt from St. Michael. The Nevech left San Francisco on March 2 last, and entered the Arctic ocean in July. She soon got caught in the ice at a point 150 miles northeast of Point Barrow. They hoisted signals of distress, trusting that the revenue cutter Bear or some of the other whalers would see them and come to their assistance. But the fog obscured them for four days, and they drifted rapidly northward with the leaguers. Finally they decided to leave the ship. On Aug. 11 the whole crew took the small boats and started across the ice. After dragging them for five miles they came to open water and embarked. The current caught them at once, and before they had gone ten miles they were in another ice pack. They then discovered that they only had five days' provisions, and they abandoned the boats and started across the ice on foot. They got back safely, and then commenced preparations for a second attempt to save themselves. All but eight men decided to push across the ice fields on foot. The weather was not bitterly cold, but it was foggy and disagreeable and necessitated more clothing than was available. A limited amount of food was carried, for they thought they would surely reach the Bear or one of the whalers within two or three days. The eight men left in the boat thought they were better off there than on the ice, and were left to their fate. Away across the treacherous ice went the 37 men and the pretty woman. But one day out the captain and his wife and seven of the others changed their minds about the likelihood of saving themselves by the method they had undertaken. These nine went back to the ship, leaving 29 on the ice. Nothing has been heard of the 29 since that day, Aug. 11. The party got back to the ship safely, and on Aug. 14 made another start with eight in the party—Captain Whitfield, his wife, and six men. They took a small canvas boat, into which they put a week's provisions. It was a heavy load for the little craft, but this was the last hope they had, and they could not take any more chances. Only the comparative quiet of the sea accounts for the miraculous escape. Rough weather would have instantly swamped them. They got into clear water in a few hours, and paddling through the fog and darkness avoided as best they could the drifting ice. Finally they could go no further, and they turned and walked over the ice. For 60 hours they kept on, first walking and now talking to the small boat. At last land was sighted. It proved to be Copper Island, a barren, desolate island, and from which position they were rescued the following day by the Bear. Captain Whitfield thinks 29 men left on the ice are surely lost.

Shenandoah, Pa., Sept. 15.—The vessel of the anchor Agnes I. Grace, which sank Aug. 5, with four 16-ton guns and 1700 lbs. of powder, was found yesterday 20 miles southeast of Tybee sea buoy. The wreck had moved about one and a half miles from the position buoyed by the United States buoy tender Waveria last Thursday. The deck was sounded in search of the guns, but they were not on board. They evidently rolled overboard when the vessel sank. The Grace is fast breaking up, and is in the path of coastwise vessels and a menace to navigation.
