GEORGE'S ACCEPTANCE VIM AND WICTOR

AN ENTHUSIASTIC GATHERING.

In Accepting the Various Nominations Tendered Him Mr. George Declared Himself the Only Candidate of True Jeffersonian Democracy.

New York, Oct. 6 .- Henry George accepted the nomination for mayor of greater New York at Cooper Union last dight. It was in the same hall and before many of the same people that he accepted the nomination 11 years ago. In 1886 he received 60,000 votes. It was the greatest outpouring of the people seen in this city during the present campaign. The doors were opened at 7:15, and in less than two minutes every seat in the big hall was occupied and the aisles, as far as the police permitted, were crowded. Hun-dreds were turned away during the next 15 minutes, and by 8 o'clock sev-eral thousand, unable to gain admis-sion, assembled outside and held open air meetings in the plass, which were addressed by several local speakers. Henry George's appearance before the meeting was the signal for an outburst of cheering that lasted three minutes. Jerome O'Nelli, of the Central Labor Union, prosided. In his opening speech
