AN EX-LEGISLATOR'S CRIME.

Murdered His Stenographer, Who Had Sued Him For Wages.

Wilkesbarre, Pa., Dec. 22.—James Griner, proprietor of the Pullman hotel at Duryea, shot and killed his stenographer, Mrs. Caroline Schaeffer, yesterday. Griner gave himself up at once and was brought to the Wilkesbarre jail. The murder is a violation of the law and an ex-member of the legislature, representing Wilkesbarre in the house of representatives in 1905. When his term expired he went to Duryea, where he purchased a hotel. He declares his family drove him to desperation. Griner has been financially embarrassed for some time past, and it made him downhearted. Yesterday he went to Scranton to confer with some creditors, returning home shortly before noon. He was then in good spirits, and told a friend that the meeting with his creditors had been in every way satisfactory, and that they had agreed to carry him along indefinitely. On arriving at his hotel he found a sheriff's sale notice tacked on the door. After a brief interview with his wife he went to the dining room and fired three shots at Mrs. Schaeffer, the third one killing her. The murdered woman was employed at the hotel as cook. She was 35 years of age. She claimed Griner owed her \$250 wages. She brought suit for judgment.

NUGGETS OF NEWS.

In spite of the new tariff the trade of Nuremberg, Germany, with this country has increased greatly. Two men were hanged in a sawmill on Pike's Peak. One of them was killed and the other is in a dying condition. Stacey Botzler, a medical student at the University of Virginia, is charged with chloroforming and robbing a college entrant. In a street fight between Ida Lemon and Queenie Skinner, at Anderson, Ind., the Skimmer woman was fatally carved with a butcher knife. The manager of Alder's tar distillery at Hull, England, and four of the employees were killed by an explosion in the works last evening. New York police have arrested a man whom they believe to be the murderer of Richard Pope, who was killed five years ago by a masked burglar.
