PETER'S SAGACITY.

HOW A MULE SAVED THE LIVES OF A WHOLE FAMILY.

The Animal Detected Danger Which His Rider Falled to Discern - Must Have Known the Murderous Apaches Were In the House He Would Not Approach,

"He was an ordinary, everyday sort of mule, with a yellow skin and a shaved tall, but he was knowing enough to save my life and the lives of Tim Masten and his wife and their two little children," said James Crossman, formerly a ranch-man in New Mexico. "He was a good sill round animal that I could put to team work of every kind, and if I had occasion to ride 50 miles he could carry me there in a day as easily as any beast I ever rode. So on this September evening in 1885, after my work of the day was done, I saddied up Peter-that was the mule's name and started over to Masten's ranch, three miles away, expecting that he would earry me there without a hitch, as he al-

ways had done before. "My ranch was in the Mimbres valley, at a place called Fairbrothers, where there was a little colony of six or seven American families strung along as many miles of the river, and we all were engaged both in farming and stock raising, with a market for our meat and regetables at the mine camps in the Black range. Masten bad the most stock of all of us, and he All our work is accompanied. kept in his employ two herders for his sheep and cattle. I knew that he had gone with his family to Mimbres that day, and, that being our postoffice, my purpose in riding over to his house was to see if he had brought me any mail. Just as I was starting from my house the thought of Chief Geronimo, then on the warpath, came to my mind, and I went back and

got my winehester rifle.
"The country along the Mimbres river could see the house, I myself being still in the shadows of the trees, when Peter, for the first time in all my experience with him, balked, and not a step farther and dug my spurs into his sides diligently, but I could not force him ahead one step. All he would do as I set the spurs into him was to sniff and step from side to side, with his ears cocked straight ahead and his nose pointed straight toward the house. There was no light in the house, but the herders were up, for the moon, shining on the veranda, showed one of them seated in a chair and the other sit-ting on the floor of the veranda, with his back against the wall.

"I wrestled about ten minutes with Pe-ter and was undecided in my mind whether I had better walk to the house or dis-mount and throw stones at the mule, as the Mexicans do with their post horses, when the thought struck me that the men on the veranda were sitting very still. They had not changed their position or moved once since I had come in sight of the house—tired and asleep after their day's work, of course, and the reason they had not gone to bed was that they were sitting up to await the return of Masten and his family. They had not returned; that was evident. And having in this way reasoned out the whole matter to my satisfaction I saw a way to compromise Peter by turning back and riding down the Mimbres road to meet Masten. The mule's feet fairly danced when I reined

of Masten's wagon wheels.
"In my ride of two miles I had had time children at a ranch a mile back while he and I went ahead and explored the premises. I was afraid he would laugh at me, but he bad heard reports in town of Indians raiding the upper valley the day be-fore, and he was quite willing to take up with my advice.

'So he left his wife and children at the ranch, borrowed a saddle to put on one of his wagon horses, and together we went to his ranch. A quarter of a mile away we tied the horse and mule in a thicket and went forward on foot. The house was still and dark. The two men were sitting on the veranda precisely as I had seen them before. While we crouched in the shadow of the trees, watching, a flickering light appeared in the house, and then, one by one, seven Apaches filed out of the door and took their way across the open space,

oming directly toward us.
"Whether Masten or I killed the Apache that fell will never be known, for we both were firing our repeating rifles as fast as we could pull back the levers. The In-dians were so near when we turned loose on them that we could hear the bullet strike this one as he fell backward. The other Indians dragged him away and were lost in the shadows before we had half emptied our magazines. They sent two or three random shots at us as they ran, and that was all the fight they made, for they were rattled and stampeded by our sudden attack, not knowing what they had ran up against. As soon as they were out of sight Musten made a dash for the house, and of course I followed. The Indians had set it on fire, but the flames had not made much headway, and we easily extin-

guished the blaze,
"Then we had time to look about us. The two herders were dead, propped up in the positions in which we found them by the indians, who, after killing them, had placed them as decoys to full the susdeions of any one approaching the ranch. The men must have been killed at nightfall after their return from work. From that time until they fired the house and started to go away the Indians had lain inside waiting for the return of Masten and his family, and they would have got them, and me besides, had not my mule Peter been for once wiser than his mar ter."-New York Sun.




