The American Express Company Robbed by a Trusted Clerk.

WESTERN RAILROADS FLEECED.

New York, Jan. 7.-The American Express company was robbed yester-day of \$10,582, and Clark Braden, Jr., a trusted employe, is missing. Central office and private detectives are hunt-

Three days ago the night manager in charge of the office at Forty-seventh street and Madison avenue was taken ill, and Braden, a clerk of the company for more than ten years, was temporarily substituted. This office the company uses as a clearing house for all its matter sent or received from the Grand Central station.

Among the parcels to be sent on the 6:30 o'clock train on the Hudson River road yesterday morning were several containing cash to the amount of \$5,582 and one containing five \$1,000 Chicago Gasbonds. It was Braden's place to take these packages to the train, return to the office and remain on duty until 7

When the day employes arrived Braden was not in the office. The safe was locked. There were no receipts for valuable packages by the morning train, although the books showed that several such parcels had been received at the

At first the absence of Braden and the receipts were set down to carelessness. But a few minutes later the leather bags which had contained the packages were found under some other eight. They had been cut open and the money and bonds taken.

That the robbery was hastily carried

out is shown by the fact that \$25,000. mostly in cash, was left in the safe, and that the bonds were taken.

The rather applopedic tone of the North German Gazette in its semi-official article on Wednesday seems to vote in the clubbe a reflection of the feeling in some ing station is hardly the realization of the great colonial enterprise which the blaze of Prince Henry's departure fore-shadowed, and the suggestion of the possibility that Kiso-Chau might prove unsuitable leads many to ask whether Germany, after all, has taken a leap in the dark.
It is now discovered that if Germany

moves further north she is bound to clash with Russian interests; if further south, then with English interests.

Already it is proposed to establish a branch of the German-Asiatic bank at Kino-Chau, and postal regulations will be issued. The government is ordering the preparation of maps and charts of the district, and the principal banks propose to begin the exploitation of the coal beds of the Shan-Tung peninsula

Various rumors are current as to onferences of the powers to settle the Chinese question, but none can be relied thinks an unnecessary noise has been made for what he calls an omelette. and he says he cannot perceive any ommercial advantage in the acquisition of Kiao-Chau.

The Deutsche Zeitung, echoing Gernan feeling, says: "England has suffered a crushing defeat, but there is no fear of war. The British lion roars. but he does not bite. All civilized na-tions ought to be grateful to Emperor William for having destroyed the myth of Great Britain's universal domina-

THE RUSSIANS ENVIOUS. Czar Wants Terms Similar to Those

Granted to Germany. London, Jan. 7,—According to a spe-cial dispatch from Shanghai Russia is endeavoring to obtain terms similar to Germany's for the occupation of Port Arthur and the Lino Tong peninsular from a point considerably north of Ta-Lien-Wan. It is believed that the at-titude of England and Japan will frustrate her designs.

The Times says this morning that it understands the term of Germany's lease of Kino-Chau to be 99 years in-

stead of five years.

A dispatch to The Times from Pekin says: "Under the agreement between Baror Heyking, German ambassador to China, and Prince Kung, president of the tsung-de-yamen, Germany will pay a nominal annual rental for Kiao-Chau. She acquires the right to begin forthwith the construction of a dock and a fortified coaling station. The belief in an early French occupation of Hai Nan Island is general."

According to a special dispatch from Shanghai the existence of an Anglo-Japanese alliance is openly asserted there in well informed quarters, an alliance to maintain the status quo in China and Corea and to declare the independence of Corea under the joint guarantee of England, Russia and Japan.




