THE INDIANS' REVENGE.

A Most Brutal Lynching Leads to More Brutal Murder.

TWENTY-FIVE REPORTED KILLED

Band of Enraged Seminoles Reported to Be Marching Against White Settiers, Leaving a Trail of Blood Behind Them-Sex or Age Not Spared.

Oklahoma City, Jan. 12.—There is an uprising in the Seminole nation, and 200 armed Indians have killed 25 citi-zens of Pottawattomic county, this territory. The Indians are seeking to avenge the recent burning of Lincoln McGeisey and Palmer Simpson, two In-dians of the Seminole tribe, who were accused of murdering and outraging Mrs. Leard, of Maud Postoffice. A special trainload of armed citizens has gone to Earisboro, ten miles from Maud, and excitement is higher than ever be-

fore known in the territory.

A telegram received by the train dispatcher of the Choctaw, Oklahoma and Gulf rallroad from the station agent at Earlesboro states that a band of 200 Seminole Indians is on the warpath. and is leaving behind it a trail of blood. The brief information conveyed was that the Seminoles were avenging the work of the mob of white men that burned two Seminole Indians at the stake on Friday last, and that the infuriated Seminoles had already massa-cred 25 men, women and children.

The station agent gave the additional information that the band started from a point six miles south of Earlsboro ith the avowed intention of setting fire to Tecumseh and killing all whom they met; that the Indians were re-ported to have changed their course and were at the time of the sending of the message headed toward Earlsboro. The receipt of this startling informa-tion has created intense excitement in South McAlester, Federal Judges Townsend and Springer, who are in the city, are anxiously awaiting further news. Scores of people who have relatives and friends at Earlsboro and other points in that section are be-sieging the telegraph office for news, but the agent has left the Earlsboro station to gather further information, or perhaps was siain or driven to seek refuge. If the Earlsboro agent cannot be reached soon by wire a train will be dispatched from McAlester bound for the scene of the reported massacre.

A special from Shawnee, O. T., says:

The train from the east last night brought to this city a car containing every woman and child at Earlsboro The passengers confirm previous reports, and say that a pitched battle between the Indians and the settlers took place yesterday afternoon near Maud Postoffice, resulting in the wiping out of several families. A message calling for men and arms has just been received from Earlsboro, saying that nearly 300 Indians have sworn vengeance on the town and are moving toward the place, declaring that they will burn it.

A special from Wewoka, I. T., de-clares that everything is peaceful in that section. The telegram says: United States Commissioner W. T. Fears and Mr. J. F. Wisdom, chief clerk to Indian Agent Wisdom, accompanied by C. P. Lynn, the national physician of the Seminole nation, went to the farm of Henry Taylor, where the burned bodies of McGeisey and Simpson are buried, and opened the temporary grave. Only the trunks of the bodies remained. The legs and arms were entirely burned off, and they were unrecognizable. A chain was around the neck of each and secured by a padiock. The chain was removed and brought back to Wewoka. It will be used as evidence in the investigation. Commissioner Fears is thoroughly investigating the matter.

It is rumored that the people along the Oklahoma line are much excited, and fear the Indians will c. and endeavor to avenge the death of their brothers. This, however, need not be feared. Second Chief Huldbutter has directed the band chiefs of the Seminole nation to urge the Indians to be quiet, and not commit any reprehen-


