Five Killed in Railroad Smash.

Montgomery, Ala., Feb. 11.—A disastrous head-on collision occurred on the Louisville and Nashville railroad yesterday near Kirkland, killing Engineer, Conductor, Fireman, Ed Davis and three white trainmen, Harry Davidson, engineer, and Will Low, fireman, were seriously injured. Charles Harrison, brakeman, had both legs cut off, and brakeman Hughes was badly hurt. Both will die. Engineer Davidson forgot to stop at Kirkland, and meet No. 11. Cars and engines were demolished.
