

POSTMASTER BEDEA.

His Assumed Charge of the Postoffice This Morning—His Deputy. Mr. Daniel Bedea assumed his position as postmaster at Shenandoah this morning, succeeding Michael Mellet, who was appointed to the position under the Cleveland administration. The retiring postmaster relinquishes the duties of the position with a record of which he may justly be proud. He was courteous and obliging at all times, and his success will no doubt prove just as faithful to the people's interests.

Mr. Bedea received the endorsement of Congressman Brumm, and the letter forwarded his name to the department on December 20th, last. It was not until last week that Mr. Bedea received his commission. Shenandoah's new postmaster was born in Union county, this state, in 1854, and is a son of the late George and Mary Bedea. He has been engaged in various mercantile pursuits, and up to the time of his appointment was a member of the Coal and Iron Police force. Mr. Bedea has been a resident of the county for the past eleven years. Although never taking an active part in political matters, he has always been a Republican.

William Reeves, who has held the position of clerk of the West Shenandoah colliery, assumed the position of deputy under Mr. Bedea by appointment. His duties will be no other changes in the present force in the office.

STEAMER BURNED, FORTY LOST.

Gold Seekers Who Left on the Clara Nevada Probably Met Death. The steamer Clara Nevada, of Seattle, was burned on Lynn canal and 49 men who were on board are supposed to have perished. The Nevada left Skagway for Juneau on Feb. 5, with a party of gold seekers, and when the steamer, which arrived from Conox yesterday, reached Juneau the Nevada had not arrived there. The day that she should have reached Juneau she was seen on the waters of the canal, and the opinion is general that the steamer was from a burning steamer. Whether the passengers and crew reached land or whether they perished is not known. It is feared that they met with death, as there has been a terrible wind and snow storm in the north, and small boats could hardly have returned. The weather has been terrible. Von Der Ahe Released. Pittsburgh, Feb. 15.—Charles Von Der Ahe, chief behind the bars of the Allegheny county jail last night, his friends in St. Louis having apparently deserted him. The promised money from the west failed to arrive yesterday, but notwithstanding this failure the balance was released today. This was accomplished by W. H. Watkins, satisfying all demands of the court, relying on the National League presidents to reimburse the club by a pro rata assessment.

Railroad Boycott Restrained. Galveston, Tex., Feb. 15.—Judge David E. Bryant, of the United States court, has issued an order restraining the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe, International and Great Northern and Missouri, Kansas and Texas railways from putting into effect the notice they served on the Lone Star line as a result of the New York conference that they would after Feb. 15 cancel all divisions with the Lone Star line and accept no freight from it without the prepayment of all charges. It is assumed that this will put a stop to the boycott, at least until the injunction is finally passed upon, and either made permanent or dissolved.

A Defiant Detainee. Reading, Pa., Feb. 15.—Henry C. Young, the defaulting city treasurer, who was recently removed from office, has refused to transfer to his successor, John G. Hoffman, \$12,000 of city money, and counsels last night declared that if he does not transfer the cash within 24 hours that criminal proceedings against him be instituted.

Child Killed by a Trolley Car. Trenton, Feb. 15.—Seven-year-old Annie Shipke was killed by a trolley car yesterday. The child was crossing the street, and seeing two cars approaching from opposite directions became bewildered. Her dress caught in the steps of the cars and she was dragged under the wheels. Mortimer Preston and Conductor Trainor were arrested and released under \$500 bail each.
