#### ACTIVITY AT LEAGUE ISLAND. The Rapid Pushing of Work Looks

Like Approaching War.

Philadelphia, March 7.—Yesterday
was a repetition of the previous Sunday
in the general activity at League Isiand navy yard. Workmen were busily engaged upon the cruiser Minneapolis the monitor Miantonomah and the ram Katahdin. In addition work was going on in the mold loft, and several forges were in operation in the blacksmith shop. The utmost reticence prevailed men at the yard, and it was impossible to obtain any official information as to the detail of the work going on. It was evident, however, that all work was

Sentries were posted at the entrance to the wharves, and only orkmen and those on business were allowed inside the lines. It was reported that five of these will be taken out of their berths as soon as possible and tested with modern guns aboard.
