### A MESENGER OF MERCY.

The Fern Relief Expedition Returns to Key West From Cuba.

TO RETURN AGAIN NEXT FRIDAY.

"Gladness of the Wretehed Cubans Stifled by Overpowering Dread, " Said an Officer of the Fern-No Mines Yet Placed at Key West.

Key West, Fig., March 15.-The United States dispatch boat Fern arrived here yesterday afternoon from Matan-The Fern's trip was uneventful. She reached Matangas on Saturday, and at once began discharging provis-ions into lighters. On shore a few persons had gathered, but there was no emonstration of any kind. The share of provisions for Matanzas was gor rid of in a business like way, and the Fern then sailed for Sagua La Grande, where the saine program was gone through on Sunday, the operation of the departure. "When you see these mines or torpedoes being placed you can make up time your mind that war is more imminent than it is at present. We are not going to risk the usefulness of expensive explosives by premature submersion. All these torpedoes can be laid in 24 hours. If we laid them now they would not only be liable to corresion but everybody on the island would get an idea of their positions.
"The delicate nature of these de-

fense torpedoes seems hardly to have been realized by theorists as to the Maine explosion. It is incomprehen sible to me that the Spanish govern ment, in times of peace, allowed high power torpedoes to lie at the mercy of the water in Havana harbor. It would be against the judgment of all experts and the practice of all governments for nowadays these weapons can be laid at the shortest possible notice. Although I do not think Havana harbor was mined, I know there are torpedoes in Morro Castle, and a naval arsenal that can be put in position very quick-

The return of the court of inquiry is wearily awaited, especially by the officers of the Maine, who will have been here a month tomorrow. They have been expecting to go to their homes on every boat of late, and now the hope deferred, added to the fact that they are still without adequate wardrobes, makes them thoroughly discontented. Their orders, which are here awaiting the court's pleasure provide that they shall return to their homes and await orders, which probably means a month's leave. The impression is growing here that the report of the court of inquiry will not be presented for some time yet.


