

CURIOUS MAINE NAMES.

The Postofice List Shows Many Traces of Early Indian Influences. There are 1,193 postoffices in the state of Maine, and, although many of them, especially in the southern and more thickly populated portions of the state, tear plain, simple, short and easily pronounced American names, there are a considerable number in what may be called "the backwoods" or the interior which bear names of Indian origin. In Aroostook county there are Wytopitlock, Mattwamkeng, Oxbow, Mooseluck, Meduxakeag and Mac-wahoctown. In Piscataquis county there are Mattagomonsis, Spurdnabunk, Un-sumtalum, Nahmakanta, Allaguash and Pamedecock. In Somerset county, Chembasabamticook, Cauquomgomoc, Mas kampbunk and Sechoomook. In Franklin county, Moostookmaguntic; in Oxford, Malehunkemunk, Parmachene and Um-

bagog. There are very few French or French-Canadian names in the whole state. By the last state census of the Pine Tree State there were 78,000 foreign born inhabitants within its borders and of this number about two-thirds, or 52,000, were Canadian, chiefly French Canadian. There were by dinavian and 13,000 Irish inhabitants in the state out of a total population of 660, 000, but notwithstanding this circum-stance and the fact that the upper particular names in these countles or in the towns composing them, although in neighboring Vermont, the total foreign population of which is, outside of the large cities, much smaller than is that of Maine, French names are largely preserved. The title Vermont is itself French (green mountain); the title of the capital, Montpeller, is taken from a French city; Grand Isle, Orleans and Mamoille are distinctively French, and many of the townships have French names, which are much easier of comprehension and much less open to the chance of mistake than are those of the pe-






