SPAIN'S FLOTILLA.

President McKinley Demands That They Proceed no Further.

Special to Evening Herald.

Washington, March 26 .- While interest here is centered in the report of the Board of Inquiry, and which will probably be sent 14.00 to Congress on Monday, accompanied by a message from President McKinley, the advance of the Spanish flotilla continues to re-

ceive the closest attention. President McKinley was to-day engaged in preparing another protest to the Spanish government declaring that her torpedo flotilla must come no neaver than Porto Rico, an island lying just off Cuba, and the only Spanish possession in this hemisphere other Military officials say the situation is grave.

PROBABLY SADUSKEY.

Ringheiser's Murderer Believed to Be in Custody Near Hornellsville,

It is believed that Charles Saduskey, who murdered Charles Ringheiser in town last Saturday night, is in custody of the police near Hornellsville, N. Y. Detective John J.

Teole and George Ringheiser, a brother of the victim, started for Syracuse this after-noon on the 12:58 Lehigh Valley train.

The grounds upon which these steps have been taken are that yesterday afternoon a telegram was received here, stating that a young man closely answering the advertical young man closely answering the advertised description of Saduskey was in the custody of Constable H. I. Lain, at Canisteo, a small town four miles east from Hornesville, N. Y.
Detective Toole received the message and

telegraphed back asking if the man in costody had the letters "C. I." tatooed on his left arm. The answer returned stated that two initials were tatooed on the prisoner's arm, but were not very distinct. The prisoner answered the rest of the description identically, the message stated. It is believed Saduskey tried to get rid of the marks.

INQUIRY BOARD SO REPORTS.

Spanish Investigators Make a Report to the Contrary.

HURRYING WAR PREPARATIONS.

The Country Is Already Practically on a War Footing, and the Work Is Reing Pushed-The Need of Intercepting the Spanish Flotilia En Route From the Canaries Is Urged by Naval Officials-Commodore Schley Ordered to the Command of the Flying Squadron at Hampton Roads and Captain Sigsbee Homeward Bound. Warships to Be Painted Black.

Washington, March 26.-The court of inquiry appointed to investigate the cause of the Maine disaster has reported that the loss of the battleship was due to an outside explosion. The state department, by direction of the president, has cabled United States Min-ister Woodford at Madrid to notify the

Spanish government of this conclusion. The president and his cabinet advisors held two extended sessions yesterday, at which the report was con-sidered in detail. Members of the cabinet stated after the meeting that the discussion was of grave character, and never since the wrecking of the Maine has the situation seemed so crit-

The Spanish government has cabled officially to Washington that the Span-ish naval commission holds the disaster to the Maine to be of internal origin. On the contrary, the Spanish government holds that the extensive armament of the Dry Tor-tugas is a more direct hostile act against Spain than any movement of the flotilia. Instead of stopping the flotilia, the persent affitude of Spain tends towards reinforcing it with other Spanish vessels, not as a menace, but from what the Spanish government feels is a requirement called for by the existing condition of affairs.

proach of the torpedo flotilla was the information received yesterday by the highest military authorities that the Spanish government had hurried to completion extensive fortifications on the Island of Porto Rico, lying just off Cuba, and the only Spanish pos-session in this hemisphere other than

modore's flag on the flagship Brooklyn next Monday. The squadron is to consist of exactly five ships, no more and no less, despite conjecture as to possible ships that might be added. Those of the squadron will be the crack armored cruiser Brooklyn, the battle-ships Massachusetts and Texas and the cruisers Columbia and Minneapolis. Other ships which are now or here-after at Hampton Roads will not be of the flying squadron, but will belon to the North Atlantic station, unde Captain Sampson. The flying squad-ron is to be a small compact fleet of the best ships in the navy for quick service at any point along the At-

lantic At the same time the north Atlantic station, under Captain Sampson, is t be further augmented. The cruiser Cincinnati, the gunboat Wilmington and the gunboat Vicksburg were yes-terday added to the fleet, which now consists, besides these three, of the New York, Iowa, Indiana, Miantonomah, Fern, Puritan, Terror, Marbie-head, Montgomery, Dolphin, Castine-Nashville, Helena, Vesuvius, torpedo boats Foote, Dupont, Ericsson, Cushing, Porter, Winslow, tugs Leyden and

The navy department was yesterday informed by cablegram from Lieuten ant Colwell, naval attache to the Uni ted States embassy at London, that agents of this government had purchased a "Schischau" torpedo boat that had just been constructed for the Ger-man government. This new acquisition is of the general type of German torpedo boats, and is regarded as a valuable addition to our navy. She is now ready for sea, and it is expected that in a few days she will leave for the United States. She is a 23 knot vessel, and about 150 feet long.
