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ANOTHER BANK CLOSED.

The People's, of Philadelphia, Now Undergoing an Examination.

Philadelphia, March 25.—On Thursday John S. Hopkins, cashier of the People's bank, died at his home here, and it was announced that he had committed suicide by shooting, and the bank was closed pending an investigation of his affairs.

It has been developed that Hopkins had transactions with Richard P. Loper, of the Guaranty Finance company, which assigned the bank's assets to Mr. Loper.

The closing of the People's bank recalled to many bankers and financial men the similarity between the careers of Mr. McKim and Mr. Singsley.

Excitement at Key West. The Mangrove Sails to Havana to Bring Away the Matine's Officers.

Key West, March 25.—The press bulletin that the court of inquiry had found the Matine was blown up by a submarine mine created intense excitement here.

As frequently stated in these dispatches, most of the naval officers at Key West have held to the opinion, shared by all the officers of the Matine, that the warship was blown up by external means.

The most significant development that followed the announcement of the court's report—a development known to few—was the sudden sailing of the lighthouse tender Mangrove for Havana.

The attention of Rear Admiral Sigsbee was drawn to the fact that Spain had officially denied that Havana harbor was mined. He replied: "If Havana harbor were mined, I should certainly have mined it."
