
FITZHUOH LER, who is sitting on 00 the powder can, does not get so excited as some of the warriors who are shiftling the battle at a range of several hundred miles.

A doop many people are expecting the guns to boom about next Monday, but they are likely to be disap pointed. War will hardly begin until all the warships and guns in the mar! et have been bought up.

THE launching of the two new battleships, the Kentucky and the Kearsarge, comes at an opportune time, and although they are still to be equipped with their machinery and fighting mechanism, they are a source of material comfort at this particular time when they may be needed before they have time for their paint to dry. Their launching marks an era in the history of the American navy. These two ships, which are of 11,525 tons displacement, are larger than any others in the navy, and their main batteries of 22 guns, besides the secondary bat teries and machine guns, make them the peers of anything that floats.

PETITIONS said to contain the signatures of 25,000 business men have been sent to the Chicago Representatives in Congress, asking them to favor the passage of the "Anti-scalping" bill now before that body. As the sole claim of the ticket scalper is that he benefits the traveling public by giving it transportation at reduced rates, it is evident either that these 25,000 alleged business men are singularly indifferent to their own [terests, or that the scalper is nuisance, and who does more barm than good. He flourishes principally in the West, and the Chicago business men are in a position to know all about him. If they have really ip denounced bim, the sooner he is sabolished the better.

The man who imagines that the course of affairs at Washington is at all uncertain or guess work is entirely in the wrong. In splite of the popular custom of flippantly criticising the ordinary Congressman, it is a fact that Congress and the President's advisers are selected from among the brainy men of the country, and Congress, with the rest of the government, is fully competent to handle any difficult question that may arise. The President has had the provis ions of international law thoroughly studied. He knows what precedents may be followed. Congressmen are familiar with parallel history. They know to quite a mathematica certainty through what avenue every step of diplomacy will lead, and what will mean war. The executive and legislative branches of the gov ernment are competent to decide what the present complication demands, and they are safe to trust under the circumstances, If the representatives of the Nation, having made the situation a study for months, conclude that war is the ultimatum, that is enough. They will tell their reasons, and the reasons will be satisfactory to the country, They are conservative men, yet judicious and courageous. The Congressman will make a speech for polical effect when it is appropriate, but when the higher need of his country calls for his wiser counsel it is just as available. And if the situation is not one justifying war we may trust and be grateful to the man who can settle a troublesome rate is maintained. matter without the sacrifice of lives and property. If we are to have war the cause is just. If we are not, there is no oceasion for it. The government is amply able to decide what shall be the future, and the people will sustain the government either way.
