According to the statements made on Tuesday by the Duke of Devonshire, lord president of the council, in the house of lords, and Mr. George Curzon, under secretary of state for foreign affairs, in the house of commons, no op-position was expected from Japan to Great Britain's action at Wei-Hai-Wei. Chicago, April 7 .- The carpenters' strike which began Monday came to sudden end yesterday, when all the larger contractors signed the union carpenters' agreement. This is a vic tory for the strikers. The strike caused 5,000 union carpenters to quit work. The agreement signed is practically the same as the one previously in force except for the provision for a weekly day, Saturday haif holiday dur ing the summer months and a more stringent enforcement of the 37% cents an hour wage scale.


