depot and state department, The United States Marine band had been secured from the barracies, and the Ser-enty-first Regiment band, under the leadership of Professor Fancinghi, for-merly conductor of the Marine band. came over from New York on an after-noon train, accompanied by a big crowd. of New Yorkers, and by 8 o'clock the crowd was 5,000 strong about the Shoreham hotel, where General Los was quartered. Before the close it was twice that rice. It was after 9 before balconies, accompanied by a committee of the Union Veterans' Legion and a Confederate Veterans' association, which was jointly in charge of the affair. There was a burst of fireworks from the neighboring houses, while mounds of red, white and blue lights flamed at intervals along the street. The crowd yelled itself hourse calling for Lee by name, and demanding a speech. The speech was brief and so much broken by applause that the crowd caught probably little more than

its general drift: General Low said: "After all the speeches I have been forced to make in the past two days, I can hardly hope to make myself heard assure you that such a great stration seems to me out of all portion to the simple fact of my hum presence here, and I am frank to say I don't see that I deserve it, having only tried to do my duty as an Ameri can where circumstances placed me."

The crowd broke out afresh, and there were yells: "That's it," That's what you del." General Lee continued "I have to thank you most heartly for this splendid endorsement of course. It is a thing that can hardly come to a man more than once in a lifetime, and it moves me more than I can put in words.

"You can act presty quick," cried a man in the crowd, and then some one yelled, "War, fight," and the cheering drowned everything eise.

"I have not come to talk war," con-tinued Lee, "but if war comes, in a few days, or in a few years, the prese crisis has proved that it will find us a united people, and the only contest will be us to who can carry the flag farthes and fastest. I want to thank my good New York friends who have come so promptly to the front tenight. It is only another evidence that New York is ready, as she has been in the past, t stand by Virginia, and if the tris comes I can ussure you all that Vir ginta will be found standing should-to shoulder with New York."

The speaking and music was followed by a very brief reception, to which few score gained admittance, in th rooms of Representative Connell, o Pennsylvania.

Consul General Lee was before the senate committee on foreign relations for an hour late yesterday. He talked freely with the committee in regard to the conditions in Cuba, and especially with reference to the destruction of the Maine. He said that in his opinion destruction of the vessel was due to Spanish agencies.
