DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS SEVERED

Spanish Minister and His Suite Leave the National Capital. Washington, April 21.—The Spanish

minister, accompanied by six members of his staff, left Washington at 7:30 o'clock last night, and the Spanish government thus terminated its diplomatic representation in the United States. The minister and his party left by the Pennsylvania railroad, going northward to Buffalo and Suspension Bridge, and thence to Toronto. By 10:40 o'clock this morning the Spanish officials were on British soil. They will stop for a day or two on the Canadian side of Suspension Bridge, and will then spend some days at Toronto From there they go to Halifax to take an ocean liner. While the minister was on this side of the border he had the protection of the passports based late yesterday afternoon by the state de-partment at his request, following the delivery of a copy of the president's ultimatum to Spain.

The departure of the Spanish party was made without noticeable demon stration, and although a considerable number of secret officers and polic were on duty at the depot there was no time any occasion for their do ing more than keeping back a crowd of curious onbookers. 
