The reception tendered William Jennings Bryan at Pottsville last evening, as the guest of the Bi-Metallic League of Selwynkill county, was all that could be desired.

A large audience greeted the Democratic standard-bearer last night, and Shennandoah was prominently represented.

SPAIN NOTIFIED

Washington, April 21.—Yesterday was a day of events in the history of the Cuban question. The signing by the president of the joint resolution requiring intervention in Cuba, the notification of that action to the Spanish minister here, his demand for passports, the department's prompt reply to that demand, the departure of the minister and the transmission of our ultimatum that Spain must evacuate Cuba and must make answer by Saturday.

Early in the morning the execution of the program for the day began with a conference between Assistant Secretary Day, ex-Secretary Foster and Secret Assistant Secretary Adee, in which the wishes of the president and cabinet as to the ultimatum were reduced to diplomatic form.

Word came to the navy department that the Spanish cruisers Pelayo, Vizcaya and Albatros, together with the torpedo boat Batilla, had sailed from Cape Verde Islands, in company with the torpedo boat Batilla. It is realized that this constitutes a most formidable naval force, in the opinion of experts, equal to our crack fighting squadron now lying in Hampton Roads.

The department is a good deal disturbed about the reported boat Somers, now lying at Baltimore. England and is casting about for means to bring her to the United States with safety, but so far without success.

No purchases of ships were made during yesterday, but the offerings here for the sale of the Spanish fleet are numerous. The military enthusiasm has spread to the capital, usually so unindustrial, and today the city is brilliant with the Stars and Stripes.

DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS SEVERED

Spanish Minister and His Staff Leave the Navy Department. Washington, April 21.—The Spanish minister, accompanied by six members of his staff, left Washington at 7:30 o'clock last night, and the Spanish government thus terminated its diplomatic representation in this country.

The departure of the Spanish party was made without noticeable demonstration, and although a considerable number of secret officers and police were on duty at the depot there was at no time any occasion for their doing more than keeping back a crowd of curious onlookers.
