

ANTI-AMERICAN DEMONSTRATION

The Civil Governor of Madrid Encouraged the Mob That Tore Down the American Eagle-Sagasta Says the "First Shot Is Almost Audibie."

Madrid, April 22.-The ultimatum of the United States was received yester-day in English. The Spanish govern-ment immediately broke off diplomatic relations with the United States, notifying the United States minister to this effect before he was able to present any note. A semi-official note, issued yes-

terday afternoon, says:
"The Spanish government having received the ultimatum of the president of the United States, considers that the document constitutes a declaration of war :gainst Spain, and that the proper form to be adopted is not to make any further reply, but to await the expiration of the time mentioned in the ultimatum before opening hostilities. the meantime the Spanish authorities had falled."
