

UNCLE SAM AND HAYTI. Objections to Furnishing Our Navy With a Naval Station.

OUR TREATY WITH SAN DOMINGO

Prevents Either Nation Giving Advantages to Foreign Governments. But a New Treaty Is Being Negotiated That Gives Us Special Privileges Port au Prince, Hayti, May 12,-Aside

from the traditional policy of the Haytlen nation, dating from 1816, excluding aliens from the holding of real property, and the strong sentiment which still exists in support of it among the ignorant majority of the population, there is a practical obstacle of no small importance to the acquisition by tion. American ministers to the twin republics have discovered that this treaty is really a more serious impediment to the progress of any negotiations look-ing to the acquisition of the Mole St. Nicolas or Samana bay than the senti-ment of the people. There is no doubt that the Haytien government would have small scruple in getting around the constitutional prohibition, by per-petual lease or otherwise, if it were not for the embarrassing position in which it would then be placed in relation to San Domingo. That republic, on the other hand, is restrained by a like reason as concerns its obligations to Hayil. A double commission to treat in both capitals at once, with the object of bringing the two governments to a joint convention in favor of the naval requirement of the United States,

might be successful where separate ne otiations would continue to fall. There is ground for the belief that both the administration of Hayti and that of San Domingo are now more cordially disposed towards America than for some time past, and the cause of this fact is largely to be found in the decisive step which the United States has taken to insure the freedom and self government of Cuba Popular sympathy among the Haytians and the Dominicans is almost wholly with the Cubans, and there has been wholly with the Cubans, and there has even been some talk of raising a naval battalion to be

joined to the American army of invasion. Friendship for America among the Haytian political class suffered at the crisis of the Lueders difficulty, through he negative diplomatic course of the United States government. It is certain that if America had at that time actively intervened to see that exact justice was done as between Lueders and the Haytian municipal authorities. restraining Germany from an act of pure despotic coercion, President Sam and all the statesmen of Havti who count for anything would for the asking have placed the future of the country absolutely in American hands. We then could have obtained whatever coaling station we desired in Hayti.

In diplomatic circles here it is per-fectly well known that the Spanish representative is mainly dependent upon M. Theodore Meyer, the French minister to Hayti, for his knowledge of the attitude of the European governments toward the Hispano-Ameri-can war. The Spanish charge d'affaires possible advantages which the United States may enjoy in Haytien ports and waters through the clauses and articles of the treaty of 1864, which pledge each of the republics to reciprocal aid and comfort in case either of them is at war with another nation. It is sugstrued and faithfully observed by Hayti, would put her in the attitude of an ally of the United States. Article 15 permits American men-of-war to take refuge in Haytion ports and to undergo repairs and be provisioned there. But the question is naturally asked whether Spain would not regard the observance of this article on the part of Hayti as an act of hostility. M. He spoke at first of the traditional sympathy between America and France, but added sig-nificantly that in the present crisis the immediate solicitude of his country was for Spain, her next door neighbor, whom she had done much to ruin in the past, but whom she did not wish to "There is one very serious fact in the situation," said M. Meyer, "and that is the undoubted irritation of all European nations except Great Britain over the American method of procedure in the Cuban affair. You are a great people, endowed with wonderful strength and resources. You have many fine ships in your navy, but Spain has more and better torpedo boats. Though one cannot doubt that if the struggle con-tinues long enough America will win, the consequences of the first success upon the nations that are spectators, irrespective of the side that secures it, must be potent and far reaching. I am astonished that the Spaniards have not shown greater enterprise at the outset. They ought to have gone di-rect to New York with a fleet of say


