London, May 25.—The Madrid correspondent of The Daily News says: "Rumors as to the negotiations of the powers in favor of peace are premature, but responsible Spanish statesmen are prepared to seize the first opportunity to end the war, provided it can be done on terms honorable to Spain."

Marshal Martinez Campos, in the course of an interview, has said that the salvation of the Philippines is in the hands of the natives themselves, and that much care ought to be exercised to win them to our side.

LETTER FROM THE "YALE"

A Former Resident of Town Writes About Her.

John Sweeney, a former resident of Lost Creek and who was at one time bartender at the Ferguson house annex, is now one of the crew on the United States auxiliary cruiser "Yale," formerly the "Paris," and writes an interesting letter to his many friends in this town and vicinity. The letter is dated Porto Rico, May 11th.

The writer says he is well and is having a nice time on the big vessel, with lots of room and plenty of good food. He adds, "We each have our own staterooms with bath and toilet. There are only twenty-five marines on board. All the rest are stewards, cooks and waiters. They are English and German. We have had a Spanish man-of-war after us every day since we have been here. The Yale is being used as a dispatch boat. We remain here until the 13th and then leave for Key West. On the 6th we passed within half a mile of the fort at San Juan. They would have fired on us, but we kept out of reach. We have the Paris captain and a naval captain as well. We cruised around the island of Porto Rico until the next morning, when we passed the fort of San Juan with our own colors.
