# HELD FOR TRIAL.

Patrick Quinn Charged With Violating the Liquor Laws. Patrick Quinn was arrested this morning on a warrant sworn out before Justice Nickel, of Pottsville, on a charge made by Victor Imbrogo, who charges Quinn with selling intoxicating liquor on Sunday and week days without a license. In West Mahanoy township, Quinn entered \$200 bail before Justice Shoemaker, in town.

This suit is a sequel to a civil suit tried before Justice Shoemaker a few days ago. Imbrogo was until recently employed as a clerk in the storehouse at the Girard reservoir above Lost Creek which Contractor M. P. Quinn is enlarging. When Imbrogo left the service he sued Contractor Quinn for \$150 wages, but upon trial Justice Shoemaker gave judgment of but \$50, it having been shown that the clerk had received payments and credits on account. The defendant in the liquor case is a relative of the contractor and the alleged violations are said to have been made where the reservoir work is progressing.

Failed to Enter. Harry Conroy and Corby Stack, two of the three boys who left their homes in town last Monday with the intention of joining the navy, returned home last night. They got not to the navy yard in Brooklyn and passed physical examination, but the officials doubted their ages. The applicants are about sixteen. They told the examiners they were eighteen years old and refused to allow the officials to write to their parents to ascertain their correct ages, hence the rejection. They returned home much disappointed. John Lally, the third boy who ran away, reached the navy yard at Brooklyn with his companions, but was rejected on the same grounds. On the homeward trip he was arrested in the railroad yard at Easton for illegally riding on a freight train. He is still at Easton.

# WAR BREVITIES.

A special from Gibraltar says two Austrian warships will sail tomorrow for Cuban waters. Martial law has been proclaimed throughout the Canary Islands, and is very rigidly enforced.

Of the 125,000 volunteers called for by the president four weeks ago 115,000 have been mustered in. The volunteer army at Chikamauga Park now numbers 35,914 men, and this will be increased by 10,000 by the close of the week. It is believed that Senator Pulcerver, minister of finance in Spain's cabinet, will provoke a ministerial crisis at the next cabinet council. Major Russell E. Harrison, son of the ex-president, has been assigned to duty on the staff of Major General Fitzhugh Lee.

The Madrid correspondent of the London Standard says a number of merchant steamers loaded with coal from England have arrived at Barcelona, Cadix and Bilbao.

An Army of 278,500 Men. Washington, May 26.—Adjutant General Corbin has prepared a statement showing the strength of the military forces of the United States when organized in accordance with the plans now under way: Regular army, 42,000 men; volunteers from states that call, 125,000; cavalry regiments at large, 3,000 men; ten infantry regiments United States volunteers (immunes), 10,000; engineers at large, 2,500; volunteers called yesterday, 75,000; grand total, 278,500.

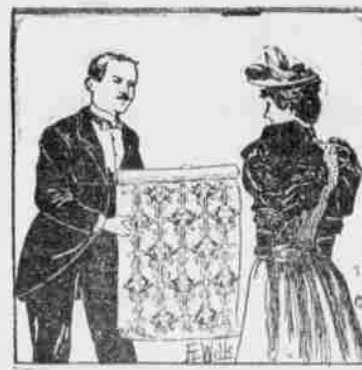
