

Key West, May 28 .- Part of Commodore Schlop's squadron solled for the west end of Cubs about noon on Thursday, May 19. It consisted of the Brooklyn, Texas, Massuchusetts and Scorpion. The Iowa salled several hours tater. The advance guard of Commodors Schloy's fleet was at Cienfuegos on Sunday het, where it was joined by the lows, Eagle and Vixen, and later by the Marblehead.

Commodore Schley had ha idea that Admiral Corvern's separatron, which is carrying guns and ammunition for Havana, would allp into Cienfaegos, which has railroad communication with the Cuban capital. Officers who have an rived here on the disputch bonts from ammodore Schley's squadron say there was discreptionanent in the fleet when it was found the Spanlards were net there. On Banday the Scorplot was sent scouting in the direction of Santiago do Culu, and on Tunaday of this week, about dusk, Commodors Commodore S klays a modron steame toward that port, the torneolor heat Dipout leaving for Key West with dispatche:

The furpoint's officers and man say there was no string at Cientinegos while they were with the fleet, which was up to the hour of its departure. The only unusual incident was a slight injury to the Dupont while confing from the Iowa in a heavy sea.

The cruiser Marblehead left Key West has Saturday; with the transport Florida, to carry General Jose Larret's force of 400 men to some point in Cuba not divulged. She lay in Key West

harbor on Thursday, and therefore could scarcely have bombarded a Cuhas town or landed ammunition for the Cubans on that day, as reported in rome dispatches.

Before reaching Cienfuegos Commodore Schley sent dispatches to Rear Admiral Sampson, in which he made no allusion to any collision with the shore batteries. His orders were to look for the Spanish squadron, not to stir up the shore guns. 


