Oregon's Republican Victory.

Portland, Ore., June 9.—About three-fourths of the vote in Oregon for the state has been counted, and shows a heavy Republican gain for governor, with a plurality of 8,777. Approximately 25,000 votes yet remain to be counted, nearly one-third of this number being in the city of Portland, where the Republicans have large minorities. Assuming the vote already counted complete returns should give Geer at least 10,000 plurality in the state. Both Republican congressmen are elected.

Inspector William Stein today received an invitation to attend the mid-summer meeting of Mine Inspectors of the Anthracite region to be held at the Allen House, Honesdale, next Monday. Mr. Stein will attend. Robert Broynke, Chief of the State Bureau of Mines, will be present and read a paper on mine inspection.
