BOOM FOR TAMAQUA.

That Town Will be the Terminal for the P. & E. Railway Company.

Tamaqua, Aug. 15.—Tamaqua as a railroad center will boom before the end of the present year.

Tamaqua will thus become the most important railroad town between Philadelphia and Williamsport, so far as the P. & E. Company is concerned.

The double tracking will be completed in a month or two. A day or two ago Herman Heiler, of Tamaqua, was awarded the contract to erect a new machine shop, new and most commodious freight house, with offices for Supt. Diez and his force of assistants and Chief Engineer Ward, as well as the regular offices for a large force of freight clerks, and a transfer.

The contractor has begun work, and next week will employ 100 more men, making 150 men engaged in the work.

The building for the shops will be 155x55 feet, and 20 feet high, consisting of two bays, on the site of the present old round house.

There is a bright prospect ahead for Tamaqua, due to the enterprise of the P. & E. officials.
