The Botkin Extradition Case. San Francisco, Oct. 11.-The Botkin case is likely to develop a sensation before the alleged poisoner is removed from the state. Governor Budd signed

the extradition warrant yesterday af-ternoon and gave it to Chlef Lees. Attornsy General Fitzgeraid thought it was legal, and that it was sufficient for her removal. Mrs. Botkin's attorney hastened to the federal court to ask Judge Hawley to issue a writ of habeau corpus to prevent the state authorities from forcibly taking the prisoner from the state, but Judge Hawley could not be found. 
