This year, in the middle of McKinley's administration, the Republican strength in the House of Representatives has been reduced from 203 to 185, a loss of only 18 members.

IT is no small thing for our financial status in Europe, that these four things should happen concurrently First, that we have signally vindi cated our ability for wise and safe government; second, that we have conducted an important war to a speedy and victorious issue without any financial derangement and with no disturbance to our trade; third. that within the last two years our exports of merchandise have exceeded our imports by \$935,000,000; and fourth, that the government ended the war with \$300,000,000 of cash in its treasury.

ST. LOUIS is the first large city in this country to adopt what is known as the "curfew" plan of dealing with the younger part of the population allowed to run at large by the thoughtless and careless parents. This idea has been put in force in a large number of smaller Western towns and villages, generally with the best results.
