and paid over by him as aforesaid, and deducting commissions and exonerations to which he is by law entitled, your petitioners verily aver, and expect to be able to prove, that the said collector is not indebted to the sum claimed in this case, but in a far less sum, if any sum at all; and that the said collector, upon a fair settlement of his accounts, is entitled to credit for a sum amounting to over \$9,000 for taxes so collected and paid over by him as aforesaid on said duplicate for borough taxes for the year 1898, and for which said sum he has not been allowed credit thereon by said borough.

Your petitioners further aver that the said sum of \$9,084.06 is not due by said collector on the duplicate for school taxes for said year 1898, as set forth in the statement filed by the School District in the above case. That the total amount of taxes charged in said duplicate amounts to the sum of \$25,198.82, and that the said collector has paid to the treasurer of said district, and is entitled to credit thereon on said duplicate, the sum of \$16,114.76 in cash, with other credits for commissions, abatements and exonerations to which he is entitled, the balance due thereon would, as your petitioners aver, and expect to be able to prove, amount to less than \$1,000.

Your petitioners further aver that there are no outstanding certain taxes on all the duplicates for the said year 1898 which are collectable, and that there has not been any proper or full settlement of the accounts of the said collector for any said duplicates, and that upon a proper settlement of the accounts of said collector, and allowances for all the credits to which he is lawfully entitled, it will appear, as your petitioners aver, and expect to be able to prove on a trial of this case, that the plaintiffs are not entitled to collect the sum alleged and contained in their statements filed by them, respectively, as aforesaid.

Wherefore, your petitioners, averring all the facts above set forth as true, as they verily believe and expect to be able to prove, pray your honorable court to grant a rule in the above case to show cause why the said judgment should not be struck off, set aside, annulled, and the same be null and void, and that they will ever pray, etc.
