Already there is talk of the probability of disposing of the treaty during the present session, and the impression is favorable to this result. few senators manifest a disposition to debate the treaty at length, and some profess unalterable opposition, but the feeling is so strong against an extra session and in favor of the postponement of the settlement of the disposi-tion of the Philippines after they come into our possession that it now seems that even the minority will consent to the treaty's ratification without ma-

terial delay.

It is likely,how-ever, that the resolution will be amended so as to make the recess begin on Wednesday instead of Thursday. The appropriation bills are farther advanc-ed now than they have been for many years at the short session. 
