Objectionable Question Withdrawn in the Botkin Case.

PROSECUTION RESTS ITS CASE.

Mr. Dunning, on Resuming the Wituess Stand, Gave Further Damaging Evidence Against the Prisoner and His Reasons For Suspecting Her.

San Francisco, Dec. 22.-John P. Dunning, who was arrested for contempt of court for refusing to answer certain questions put to him by counsel for Mrs. Botkin, was released from custody yesterday. He appeared in court and Attorney Knight withdrew the obnoxious question, thus giving Judge Cook an opportunity to order his release. Mr. Dunning then appeared on the wit ess stand and gave further testimony point-

ing to Mrs. Botkin as the guilty woman. Dunning was hauled over the coals for the attorney for the defense, who persisted in trying to introduce every disgusting detail of the case, in spite of the protests of the witness. who clothed his language, as well as circumstances would permit, but leav-ing no one in doubt as to is meaning. Nevertheless, the Botkin attorneys persisted in asking pointed questions, and insisted on answers being given in absolutely unmistakable language—the language of the street. Dunning's efforts to save the ears of his listeners met with the approbation of the more respectable of those in the court room.

Dunning's testimony referred to the letters he had received and written from and to Mrs. Botkin after he left San Francisco for Cuba, where he was a newspaper man it the field. He explained that his hostility toward Mrs. Botkin commenced on his receipt of the news of the means used in causing his wife's death. He said that Mrs. Botkin was the first person he thought of who would have committed the crime. His other testimony referred to his relations with Mrs. Botkin. He ex-onerated Mrs. Corbelly and Mrs. Calimberg of any wrongdoing in the case and told of their friendly acts to him and his family.

Handwriting experts showed almost conclusively that Mrs. Botkin wrote the address on the candy box and the anonymous letters. The prosecution then closed its case,

## ANOTHER WAR HERO.

Ensign Ward Kept Our Government Informed From Enemy's Country. Washington, Nec. 22.—The official reports of the commanding officers of the navy during the war have been compiled and published by the navy de-partment. While treating of events that have already figured in official reports that have rouched the public the documents still contain many minor re-ports that throw side lights on intercating phases of the war. In the brief record of the proceedings of the naval war board an unknown here is brought to light in the person of Ensign H. H. Ward, who at the beginning of the war was on duty in the navigation bureau, alternating with Lieutenant Whittlemey in the heavy duties of assistant to the chief of the bureau. He volunteered for secret service duty, and his exploits, about which nothing has been said in the past, may well be placed on record beside those of Lieutenant Ro-wan in Cuba and Lieutenant Whitney

In Porto Rico.
Within a week after the declaration of war Ensign Ward disguised himself and went straight into the heart of the enemy's country, making his headquarters at Cadiz, the principal Spanish naval station, and informing the navy department here of the actual navy department are an area of the strength of the Spanish naval vessels and their movements. Then he went to the West Indies and reported everything that was going on there of La-portance to the American navy. Next, he went again into the enemy's country in disguise, this time to Porto Rico, where he was arrested as a suspicious character and a spy. By advoltness he managed to secure his release, and es-caping from San Juan cabled the navy lepartment a full account of the state of the defenses there and the preparaions making for the reception of the Spanish squadron under Cervera. All this time even the officials of the navy department were under the impression that Mr. Ward was engaged in installing a system of coast signals on the New England coast.

## TO SUCCEED MR. BLISS.

Ethan Allen Hitchcock the New Secretary of the Interior.

NOW AMBASSADOR TO RUSSIA.

Mr. Hitchcock Became a Close Friend of the President When the Latter Was Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee of the House.

Washington, Dec. 22.-The president yesterday nominated Ethan A. Hitch-cock, of Missouri, to be secretary of the interior. Mr. Hitchcock is at present ambassador to Russia. He was appointed minister more than a year ago. and when the rank was raised to an embassy was reappointed.

Mr. Hitchcock is a business man of St. Louis, and was for some time an extensive plate glass manufacturer He is a great grandson of Elthan Allen. of revolutionary fame. His ancestors were from Vermont, but his father moved south, and Mr. Hitchcock was born at Mobile, Ala. Senator Proctor, who was in St. Petersburg during the past summer. The past summer was the senator popular in the diplomatic corps and among the acquaintances he has made abroad. Mr. Hitchcock went to St. Louis in 1851 and engaged in business there up to 1860, when at the urgent request of

relatives he left for China as the representative of important business inter-Returning to St. Louis in 1874 Mr. Hitchcock was up to the time of his appointment as minister to Russia actively engaged in business in St. Louis as president of several large manufacturing and railway corporations, which positions he resigned to accept the portfolio tendered him by President McKinley. He and the president became close friends when Mr. Mc-Kinley was framing his tariff law, Mr. Hitchcock was at Washington frequently in connection with the making of tariff schedules on glass, and naturally became intimate with the then chairman of the ways and means committee of the house.

The president, at the time of the resignation of Secretary Bliss, which occongress, and which was final, invited Senator John C. Spooner to take the seat in the cabinet vacated by Mr. Bliss. Senator Spooner, it is stated, took the matter under advisement for two or three days, but after consider-ing it notified the president that he felt obliged to decline it.

Secretary Bliss said in an interview with a press correspondent: "It has been understood for some time that it would be my wish to retire from public life on the conclusion of the war. Now that the peace treaty has been signed my request to be re-lieved will be granted, but I shall await the arrival of my successor before sev-ering my connection with the interior department. I have been in most bearty accord with the president in his policy through the trying days in which he sought to avoid war, and while as commander-in-chief he was conducting the war that came, notwithstanding his efforts to prevent it. I believe most thoroughly in the course he is now pursuing for maintaining the honor of the country by securing the just re gults of a successful war. I shall leave my associates of the cabinet and of the department and my friends in Wash ington with great regret, but private and personal reasons make my retirement a necessity,"

Major Harrison's Little Surprise. Havana, Dec. 22.—It now appears that the raising of the Stars and βtripes over Fort Atares on Tuesday by Major Russell B. Harrison was a surprise to both the United States and the Spanish military commissioners The American commissioners had agreed that no American flag should be raised until Jan. 1. Major Harrison did not know this, and when told to occupy the fort with a detachment of the First North Carolina regiment he promptly raised the flag. Nevertheless, though it flies in full sight of the harbor and city, the Spaniards have not complained, and it has not been ordered down.




