TRIAL OF MRS. MOORE.

Charged With Working the "Badger Game" on Martin Mahon.

THE DEFENDANT ON THE STAND.

The Adventuress Tells the Story of Her Life-The Daughter of a Judge of the Supreme Court of Oregon-Her Marriage With Moore Established.

New York, Dec. 23 .- The taking of evidence in the case of Fayne Strahan Moore, accused of robbery in the first Moore, accused of robbery in the first degree, was resumed yesterday before Recorder Goff. Three witnesses gave testimony confirming that of Martin Mahon, the alleged victim of the badger game. Then Mrs. Fannie E. Johnson, who lives in West Fifty-seventh street, where it is alleged Mahon took Fayne Strahan Moore, said she knew Mahon and also the defendant, but did not know William A. E. Moore. She testified that she had asked Fayne Moor in the Tombs why she did not turn state's evidence. Mrs. Johnson broke down at this point and shed many tears. In reply to a question she said Fayne Moore said she would not turn state's evidence, because Moore said he would kill her. The rest of her tes-timony was given up to answering questions more or less relevant to the case, and then the waiter from the Metropole, who served dinner to Mr. Mahor and the alleged Mrs. Moore, was put upon the stand.

This ended the case for the prosecution and Mr. Levy, the attorney for the defendant, moved for a dismissal of the complaint on the ground that the prosecution failed to establish its case.

This motion was denied. Annie Fitzgerald, matron of the city prison, was called as the first witness for the defense. She denied having heard Mrs. Johnson advise Mrs. Moore to turn state's evidence, and also de-nied other parts of Mrs. Johnson's evidence. At this point the court ad-

Later in the evening the court was again called to order, and the opening was devoted to continued testimony of Mrs. Fitzgera'd. After her came Rev. Ogden D. Homans, rector of St. Matthew's Protestant Episcopal church in West Eighty-fourth street, who testified that on April 9, 1897, he performed a marriage ceremony between William A. E. Moore and Fayne Strahan. He said the defendant was the woman. Moore was brought into court and Dr. Homans identified him as the man. Favne Strahan Moore was then called the stand and examined by Mr. Hill, She said that she was born on Feb. 23, 1877. Her father was judge of the sufreme court of Oregon when he died in July, 1887. She then removed to At lanta, Ga., and came to New York in the spring of 1896. She came here, she said, with the intention of completing her musical studies. She went to Eu-rope, returning in July, 1896. She said that she first met Mahon in August. 1896, on the occasion of a musicale at the Amsterdam hotel. She said that Mahon had, uninvited, called upon her then she was living at Gramercy Park. Mahon, she said, told her he was a married man, but was not living with his wife. He frequently took her carriage riding and to the theater. She then went to Atlanta, and on returning took a room at Mrs. Johnson's house, at Mahon's suggestion. She said the last time she had seen Mahon previ-ous to her marriage to Moore was in

January, 1897. She told of her trips with Moore in this country and abroad. She then said that on the morning of Nov. 4 she reseived a telephone message from Mahon asking her to take supper at the Metropole. The rest of her testimony recounted the supper in the rooms of the Grenoble, to which hotel which Moore appeared and demanded the money from Mahon. She also spoke of the scene between Moore and Deectives Cuff and McNaught, but denied knowing that Mahon had given any money to Moore. When asked by Mr. Hill if she knew of any scheme of Moore's to extort money from Mahon, or whether she had entered into any conspiracy for the purpose, she answered emphatically in the negative. An American's Prediction Regarding the Future of Asia.

RUSSIA, ENGLAND AND CHINA,

Says John W. Bookwalter, of Ohlo, tsla-Russin's Friendship For Amer-

ten 1s Genutue. London, Dec. 23.-John W. Bookwalter, of Ohio, who has just returned a guarantee. from a three month's journey through Russia, told this correspondent in an interview that he enjoyed unusual facifities for observing what is going on in that country. He traveled 17,000 miles to the terminus of the Trans-Siberian railway, to the end of the line reaching the frontier of Afghanistan. and to the end of the one penetrating China through Manchuria. All these

are now practically completed. "Everywhere I found," said Mr. Bookwalter, "the kindest and most friendly feeling towards America and Americans, and heard many expressions of satisfaction over America's success in our war with Spain. To this there was not a single exception. Wherever I went everything was thrown open to me simply because I was an American.

"A great surprise to the world is in preparation in that part of the earth, and it will come. I believe, very soon. Not many years will clapse before the world will see Russia, England and China combining for the partition of Asia. The very force of circumstances will bring this about. England and Russia will never be able to agree on a partition of China between themselves. Still less will they allow the other pow ers to share with them in the spoils of that empire. They will be forced to defend China, which alone is helpless against the rest of the world, and to share with her the dominion of Asia.

"The alliance of England, Russia and China—of two-thirds of the human race will be such an alliance as history has never yet seen, and it will be onwhich will give peace to the world for centuries. All its interests will make peace, and it will be able to die tate terms to the rest of the world.

"Russia in the last three years ha done more to open the doors of China than England and all the rest of the world has done in 50 years. No one what Russia alone has done and is still doing in central Asia.

"No human power can stay the on-ward march of the Siav through Rus-sia, which will be the feature of the twentieth century, just as the march of the Anglo-Saxon through America has been the feature of the nineteenth. "The United States will be committing a woeful mistake if she falls to re-tain the friendship of this great world power of the future."

FILTH OF AGES CLEARED AWAY.

Citizens of Santlago, Heretofore Unac customed to Cicanliness, Have Made a Complete Surrender to the Saultary Authorities.

Washington, Dec. 21.—Robert P. Porter, special commissioner for the Uni-ted States to Cuba and Porto Rico, has returned from Santiago and has submitted his report to the secretary of the freesury. While in Porto Rico Mr. Porter held public hearings, and all persons interested in the weifare of the island were invited to submit statements and give oral testimony. The disagreeable smells of the typical Cuban city, his report says, are less pronounced in Santiago, while white wash, limewash, fresh paint and al sorts of disinfectants have decolorized the surrounding atmosphere and made the old town quite habitable. The streets are no longer used as sewers and the unhappy individual who vio lates the law and escapes the lash of the sanitary commissioners whip is compelled to work on the streets for 30 days. This official, Major Barbour. with 126 men dressed in spotiess white and 12 United States mule teams and able to keep them absolutely clean. Every day, by the aid of petroleum, the garbage of the city is burned. The work of sanitation is not confined to the streets, but extends to the dwelling houses, shops and buildings of all kinds. To accomplish this, how amashed in and people making sewers

Instant relief. respectable citizens were forcibly brought before the commanding general and sentenced to aid in cleaning the streets they were in the habit defiling. In the same manner local government has been restored and native mayors and officials appointed, the only require-ment being that persons accepting such offices shall take the oath recognizing the military occupation of the island by the United States, but in no way committing them to any future form of government.

The Spanish, when in possession of Cuba, not only assumed absolute control of the judiciary, but of the municlpal government, the larger portion of the taxes raised for municipal pur-poses being diverted, with the other revenues, in channels which, says the report, either went to Spain or in Spanish pockets. Mr. Porter advises that these taxes bereafter must be used exclusively for local purposes, and as far as may be deemed practicable that they be collected and disbursed by properly constituted local authorities.


