

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### BOERS VERSUS BRITONS.

A Spirit of Unrest Prevails in the Transvaal.

THE RAND POST TALKS OF WAR.

The British Consul at Johannesburg Impressed by the Personnel of a Mass Meeting That Presented Him With Resolutions of Protest.

London, Dec. 30.—A disquieting sit-uation is developing at Johannesburg. According to the latest advices from there the place is seething with dis-content, as on the eve of the Jameson raid, in consequence of recent and pro posed government measures which the Ultlanders regard as being a fresh series of impositions. In addition racial animosity is intensifying at the vexatious treatment of the British-Indians and Cape "Boys," which is arous-ing much bitterness. There was a serious development last week, when a Boer policeman murdered an Englishman named Edgar, entering

the latter's house and shooting him. The policeman was arrested upon the

charge of murder, but on the following day the charge was reduced to one of manslaughter, and the policeman was allowed his liberty on bail. The British agent demanded a restitution of the charge of murder, and a mass meeting. which was attended by 5,000 Ultlanders. was held at Johannesburg on Saturday to protest against the murder of Edgar and to present the British consul with a strongly worded petition to the queen reciting the wrongs of the Uitlanders and appealing for protection and demanding such other steps as may be isting intolerable state of affairs." There were no speeches, owing to the laws prohibiting political gatherings.
The demonstration was very impres sive. The petition was presented to the consul on the balcony of the consulate, the whole multitude signifying assent by uplifting their hands. References to the Boer policeman elicited shouts of "Lynch him!" The meeting, however, was peaceful with the exception of a slight afray with the police at its

conclusion. The newspapers publish venomous articles on the subject. The Boer organ, The Rand Post, discusses the prospect of war with Great Britain and advises that on the first British act of war the women and children at Johannesburg be given 24 hours to leave, and that the whole place be then razed.

President Kruger, in the course of an interview, has asserted that he deprecates the warlike article published by the Boer organ, and declares that he will prohibit a proposed anti-Jameson demonstration.

The Johannesburg correspondent of The Daily Mail, who utters a warning against the optimistic reports cabled to London in the Kruger interest, says:

"I have interviewed the British con sul, who said that the Saturday dem onstration impressed him as based upon deep public feeling, while the deputa-tion which presented the petition was to his personal knowledge, composed of men of high character and standing. "Signs are multiplying that the Ult-lander sentiment has been aroused to the point of asserting claims for justice. The ex-reform leaders are debar-

the point of asserting claims for jus-tice. The ex-reform leaders are debar-red, under pain of banishment, from interfering in politics, but they declare that despite Pretoria terrorism they will not keep silent much longer. The present temper of the community is such that opposing demonstrations will almost inevitably be followed by serious riots.

### SNOW UPHOLDS ROBERTS

The Mormon President Discusses Presbyterian Charges.

ROBERTS WON AS AN AMERICAN.

The Religious Question Did Not Enter Into the Election-The Teaching of Polygamy by the Mormon Church Has Been Permanently Discontinued

Sait Lake City, Dec. 30.—In connection with the election of B. H. Roberts to congress and certain charges cir-culated by the Presbyterian Board of Missions, President Lorenzo Snow, of the Mormon church, furnished a signed statement to an afternoon paper here in which he says in part;

"I declare must solemnly and em-phatically that the statements which are being published to the effect that the Mormon church is encouraging the teaching of polygamy are utterly untrue. Ever since the issuance of the manifesto on this subject by President Wilford Woodruff, my predecessor in office, polygamous or piural marriages have entirely ceased in Utah. "Since my accession to the presidency

of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints I have repeatedly asserted my intention to stand by that manifesto and my determination not to per-mit any marriage to take place under the sanction of the church which is contrary to the law of the state, and I now reaffirm that statement.

"The implied understanding with the nation when Utah entered the Union as a state has been sacredly observed.



LORENZO SNOW. There is no intention or disposition on the part of the church to violate or depart from it in the future. The enabling act required a provision in the constitution of the state of Utah that polygamous or plural marriages should be forever prohibited. Laws have been framed in support of this constitutional amendment. Heavy penalties are pro-vided for in case of their violation. "The election of Mr. B. H. Roberts

to the office of representative in con-gress from Utah was an entirely secu-lar affair. Non-Mormons participated in his nomination in the regular con-vention of his party. Non-Mormons also aided in his election. Many Mor-mons, not being of his party, voted for his opponent. He was elected as an American citizen by American citizens, and the question of religion did not enter into the purely political contest The church has nothing to do with the ction of congress in relation to his

"If, however, notice is to be taken of the wild statements and anti-Mormon fulminations in the pulpit and the press to the effect that Mr. Roberts has violated state legislation and the requirement of the enabling act it is proper for me to state, as I do most positively that the charge, which incidentally affects the church of which we are both ion in fact. If he should be unseated the result as to polygamy would be no different. There have been no polyga nous marriages since 1890. There is no movement in the church for the revivaof such unions. I am personally op posed to any such change. My asso clates in the leadership of the churculite with me in this determination.

Limn's Mysterious Bank Robbery, Lima, O., Dec. 30.-Great indignation exists here over the investigation of the robbery on Christmas night of the American National bank. Detectives that the robbery was done by those having knowledge of the combinations and that the time lock was-left unseaccidentally or otherwise. Vice Presi-dent Michael has heretofore exonerated those connected with the bank. Cashler Kaib says be has labored for years to build up the bank and holds \$38,000 of stock. While the solidity of the bank is not affected by the robbery of over \$18,000, yet the stock is affected, and some who are now being occused in some quarters are the heaviest losers.

Absconding Merchant Captured. Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 30.—The Consti-tution says: S. Lafayette Almand, a Georgia merchant, who is charged with absconding with some \$40,000 or \$50,000 was arrested in Tulare, Cal., last Sun-day morning, and Monday night City Detective Hewitt started for California after the absconder. Almand was a merchant in this state, with headquarters at Convers, and did a large bust-ness. He had the confidence of the business men of the state, and almost unlimited credit.

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
