### AN AWFUL EXPLOSION. It Destroys Shipbuilding Works and

Kills Nine People in England, London, Jan. 7.-A big boller while being tested in Hewitt's shipbuilding yard, at Harking, burst yesterday and the superintending engineer and eight men were killed. About 40 persons were injured, some fatally. The bodies of the dead wer frightfully mutilated. The whole shipbuilding works was wrecked. A lad was found dead 300 yards from the scene of the disaster. A number of men and boys are miss-

The terrific force of the explosion may be judged from the fact that one of the huge plates of the boller plung-ed through a building a quarter of a mile distant, and that debris was hurl-ed hundreds of yards in all directions, The factory liself, which covered sev-eral acres, was practically razed, and all the dwellings and shops in its im-mediate vicinity were to all intents and nurposes wrecked. Windows were shattered a mile away, and telegraph and telephone wires were blown down

Distressing scenes were witnessed among the mothers, wives and other relatives of the employes.
