A lock manufacturing plant is to be established at Bellefonte.

It is thought the Schuylkill soldiers now at Augusta, Ga., will go to Cuba after the 20th inst.

Miss Marie Connell, of town, won the \$5 classed off at the East Coast fair.

A Catholic temperance club society has been organized at St. Clair.

The new P. & R. depot at Tamaqua will be occupied on Monday by Supt. Dies and his force.

At Red Rock colliery, Luzerne county, Andrew Gola was killed by falling rock.

While coasting in North Lebanon, J. Eugene Reinhard, George Freshley and John Meyer were seriously hurt by the collision of their boat with a tree.

John Burdick, attempting to board a train at Plymouth, Luzerne county, was killed.

A shooting match, for \$50, has been arranged between Martin Murphy, of East Creek, and John Toole, of Wm. Penn, on the 25th inst.

The next meeting of the Schuylkill County Phœnix Association will be held in February at Pottsville.

Judge Ehrigood yesterday granted 103 liquor licenses in Lebanon county, including two new ones.

Since the first of the year the Reading company has sent 40 box cars to Slatersburg to be loaded with roofing slate for export.

Anthracite coal has been discovered on the farm of Samuel Burrell, near Penn Hall, Centre county.

A tribe of the Improved Order of Red Men will soon be instituted at Nazareth, with a charter membership of 75.

The Chief of Police of Mahanoy City has stopped the speeding of horses on the public streets of the town, which are hereby authorized and empowered to grant a license to all public drivers every night except Sunday night on application of the driver and to 12 persons of a proper character, upon a receipt from the Borough Treasurer that he received from the applicant or applicants, the sum required by this ordinance for license of said dancing school, ball, etc.; provided, that no charges shall be made to any of the fire companies for the privilege of holding their annual balls or picnics.

Sec. 3.—All dancing schools, balls, etc., shall be subject to the payment of the following license, viz: Each and every dancing school or class, for each night, to 12 o'clock p. m., one dollar; every ball, two dollars per night; all other amusements, exhibitions, shooting galleries, etc., not already provided for by ordinance, shall pay into the borough treasury the sum of one dollar for each night until 12 o'clock p. m. for each and every day or night they shall do business, etc., in the Borough of Shenandoah; the Chief Burgess and High Constable and police of the borough being required to enforce all of the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 4.—Each and every person offending against this ordinance shall pay for every such offense the sum of not less than five dollars, nor more than fifty dollars, to be recovered as a civil debt, and shall be liable to the borough treasury for the use of the borough, or shall upon failure to pay said fine and all other assessments, be liable to the borough for a term not exceeding four months, at the discretion of the Chief Burgess or Justice of the Peace before whom the case shall have been tried.

Sec. 5.—All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

**AUDITOR'S HEARING.**  
Claims Presented Against the Scanlan Estate Sale Proceeds.  
J. B. Coyle, Esq., Auditor appointed by the court to pass upon the claims presented against the proceeds of the Sheriff's sale of stock in Tax Collector M. J. Scanlan's store, had a hearing on the claims in his office in the Boddell building this morning.  
The sale was made under the execution issued at the instance of the Borough of Shenandoah in the case against Mr. Scanlan and his bondsmen to recover the balances due on the six duplications of 1895 and 1896. The net amount realized was \$307.01. Borough Solicitor Burke was in attendance at the hearing to protect the interests of the borough.  
Mr. H. W. Titman appeared in person and presented a new claim for four months, aggregating \$200, in behalf of the Titman Estate.  
John Connor, who was a clerk employed in the store by Mr. Scanlan, appeared in person and by counsel S. G. M. Hollister, Esq., and presented a labor claim for six months salary, aggregating \$240, which was objected to by Solicitor Burke on the ground that the notice of the claim was not in conformity with the law.  
Auditor Coyle will make a report to the court at an early day.

**AN ORDINANCE.**  
REGULATING THE HOLDING OF BALLS, DANCING SCHOOLS, ETC., OF THE BOROUGH OF SHENANDOAH.

Sec. 1.—Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Shenandoah, and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same, that from and after the passage of this ordinance, no public dancing shall be held in the Borough of Shenandoah without a license first obtained from the Chief Burgess or Justice of the Peace, in his absence, from the President of Council.

Sec. 2.—The Chief Burgess, or in his absence the President of Council, is hereby authorized and empowered to grant a license to all public dancers every night except Sunday night on application of the driver and to 12 persons of a proper character, upon a receipt from the Borough Treasurer that he received from the applicant or applicants, the sum required by this ordinance for license of said dancing school, ball, etc.; provided, that no charges shall be made to any of the fire companies for the privilege of holding their annual balls or picnics.

Sec. 3.—All dancing schools, balls, etc., shall be subject to the payment of the following license, viz: Each and every dancing school or class, for each night, to 12 o'clock p. m., one dollar; every ball, two dollars per night; all other amusements, exhibitions, shooting galleries, etc., not already provided for by ordinance, shall pay into the borough treasury the sum of one dollar for each night until 12 o'clock p. m. for each and every day or night they shall do business, etc., in the Borough of Shenandoah; the Chief Burgess and High Constable and police of the borough being required to enforce all of the provisions of this ordinance.
