He was educated at a private commercial school, and was then sent to England for two years to learn the language and to become acquainted with the commercial schools of the commercial school English methods of business. On his return to France he went to Ambolse and mastered the business of a currier. When quite young he married the daughter of Mr. Belluot, an attorney at Amboise. Almost immediately afterward he settled at Havre, and he soon became a leading ship owner. The better to fit himself for the discharge of his public duties he prac-ticed public speaking by lecturing on history to an evening class of adults.

He became president of the Havre
Chamber of Commerce, and during the
France-Prussian war held the office
month. of deputy mayor of the city. At the head of volunteer firemen, organized by himself, he extinguished the con-flagrations started at Havre by the communards. In doing this he was slightly wounded by a shell. During the war Gambetta sent him to England to buy arms.

In August, 1881, he offered himself as a Republican candidate for parliament in the Third district of Havre, and was elected. He was appointed under secretary of state for the colonies in the Gambetta administration, formed in November of that year, and held the same office in the ministries of M. Jules Ferry (1883), M. Brisson (1885) and M. Tierard (1887), In 1891 he became min-Ister of marine in M. Dupuy's cabinet and was appointed vice president of the chamber of deputies, a position to which he was several times elected. On the retirement of M. Casimir-Perier, who resigned the presidency on Jan. 16, 1895, he was chosen president by 450 votes, as against 361 given to

In 1897 M. Faure went to St. Petersburg to return the visit of Emperor Nicholas, and while there the definite announcement of the treaty of alliance between France and Russia was made. He filled many important public of-fices, but in the midst of almost gen-eral corruption he passed unscathed.
