DIGGING IN THE RUINS.

The Search For Victims of the Windsor Hotel Fire.

FORTY-FOUR ARE STILL MISSSNG.

The List Is Doubtless Exaggerated. It Includes the Name of Actor Haworth. Who Has Turned Up Safe in Philadelphia.

New York, March 20.-In a drigsling rain more than 200 men continued yesterday to work among the debris and amouldering ruins of the Windsor hotel searching for the bodies of those who perished in the flames and to recover any valuables that might have escaped the ravages of the fire. The efforts of the searchers were futile, however, as the ruins were too hot to permit much progress, and the smoke arising from the burning material was rendered more dense by the dampness of the atmos-phere. At intervals during the night flames burst forth from the burning embers and drove back the workmen. Work was begun in the morning to de-molish the fragmentary portions of walls on the east and north sides of the burned building, and later the number of workers was reinforced and the work of removing the rubbish pushed as vigorously

When they dig down a little way the debris is so hot that they are obliged to move to another locality.

During the day workmen were engaged in picking to pieces the six story wall standing on the Forty-seventh street side of the hotel, in order to make a search in the rains safer. The second 85-foot chimner was dynamited shortly after 3 o'clock in the afternoon. The explosion wrecked a number of plate glass windows and doors in nearby resi-

A large force of men were at work during the afternoon on what was the main entrance to the hotel. It was ex-pected that bodies would first be found there. A large amount of small articles. principally the personal property of the guests, was found.

Daniel Sweeney, the emergency wreck-er of the building department, and three men had a narrow escape from injury and possibly death about 5 o'clock. The four men were on top of the six-story wall, which was still standing on the up suddenly, and Sweeney felt the wall trembling beneath him. He cried out a warning, and the men hurried from their dangerous perch. They were just outside the danger zone when a great section of the wall, 30 feet or more square and including that portion where they had been working, went down with a roar. A portion of it fell on the roof of the house back of the hotel, wrecking the roof. The house had been emptied by order of the building department, and nobody was injured.

Last night the persons living in the three houses nearest to the wall on Forty-seventh street were ordered out by the police, because of the danger of its being blown down by the high wind.

That some of the missing are buried beneath the ruins is generally believed, but there is no doubt that the list is greatly exaggerated. In the list is the name of Joseph Haworth, the actor. Mr. Haworth's sister, in Cleve-land, had received a letter from him saying that he was going from Atlantic City to the Windsor hotel, in New York, and supposed he had done so. Mr. Haworth, however, reached Philadelphia from Atlantic City last night, and telegraphed

OUR BRITISH RIVALS.

Our Exports Now Exceed These of

Washington, March 20.—Ambassador Choate's recent remark that the United States and the United Kingdom would doubtless continue a friendly rivalry in regard to the world's commerce is quite justified by the latest figures on the commerce of the two countries as supplied by the treasury bureau of statistics. These show that the exports of domestic merchaudise from the United States in the eight months ending with February the eight months ending with February amount to \$829,335,141 and those from the United Kingdom amount to \$798,-960,427. In the calendar year 1898 the domestic exports from the United States amounted to \$1,233,564,828, while those of the United Kingdom amounted to \$1,131,944.331. The year 1898 was the first in which the domestic exports from the United States exceeded the domestic exports from the United Kingdom. On only two occasions prior to 1898 have the domestic exports of the United States exceeded a fellion dollars, while those of the United Kingdom have constantly exceeded a billion dollars during the past 20 years. The latest year in which her exports of domestic merchandise fell below the billion dollar line was in 1879, when they amounted to \$928,-929,026. In 1879 our own exports of domestic merchandise amounted to \$754. 656,755. Thus, in the 20 years since 1879, the figures show an increase of but 22 per cent in the domestic exports of the United Kingdom, and of 63 per cent in those of the United States.
