PEACE PROCLAMATION

Will Be Issued to Filipinos by President Schurman.

AGUINALDO'S SAVAGE METHODS.

He Orders the Summary Execution of One of His Generals Who Urged a Cessation of Hostilities and Passes Death Sentence on Twelve Others.

Manila, March 21.-The United States Philippines commission has held its first meeting and decided to issue a pronunciamento to the inhabitants of the islands. President Schurman will prepare it. The document will explain the spirit in which the United States intends to fulfill the trust imposed and will call upon the people of the islands to lay down their arms and co-operate in the interest of good government.

It is reported on hitherto reliable authority that Againaldo is taking exereme measures to suppress signs calculated to cause a cessation of hostilities. Twelve adherents of the plan of independence, residents of Maulia, have been condemn-

residents of Manila, have been condemned to death because they wrote advising surrender, and all loyal Filipinos have been called upon to perform the national service of dispatching them.

On Friday last General Lagarda visited Malolos for the purpose of advising Aguinaldo to quit. He argued with the insurgent leader and attempted to convince him of the folly of his persistence in the face of overwhelming odds. Aguin. in the face of overwhelming odds. Aguin-aldo was furious at the advice and ordered General Lagarda to be executed immediately. The unfortunate general was promptly decapitated.

McKinley is today on Jekyl Island, the club home of a number of eastern millionaires on St. Simon's sound, ten miles up the coast from Brunswick. With him are Mrs. McKinley, Vice President and Mrs. Hobart and Senator Hanna. They are the guests of ex-Secretary of the Interior Cornelius N. Bliss. In another cottage on the island is Speaker Thomas B. Reed. All persons in any way concerned in their presence at Jekyl assert positively and unreservedly that the visit of the two rival political leaders at the same time is a mere coincidence. The speaker will probably leave Jekyl this afternoon or tomorrow and the president tomorrow forenoon.

ANOTHER KANSAS HORROR.

Father Charged With the Murder of

His Five Children. Hutchinson, Kan., March 21.—An atroclous crime was revealed here yesterday when the coroner and his assist-ants removed the dead bodies of five little children from the house occupied by John Moore, which burned at an early hour. A coroner's jury investigated the case, and in accordance with the jury's return Moore, the father of the dead children, was arrested on a charge of murder.

When the firemen and neighbors reached the burning house the father was the only member of the family of seven found outside. His actions were queer and he would not talk. While the building was still burning, and his children were within the burning walls, he took a horse from his stable and rode away. When the firemen entered the house after having partly quenched the flames they found the five children lying side by side in a bed on the floor, all dead, but not badly burned. The skull of each child was deeply indented and from the dents long fractures extended. All but one of the children had been atabbed in the neck. Belleved to Be Dying When the Three Killed at Laredo, Tox., Before

Order Was Restored. Laredo, Tex., March 21.-The crisis In the disturbance here over the carregulations in suppressing the smallpox epidemic seems to be passed. When the work of removing the patients was re-sumed yesterday the scenes of Sunday State John Sherman was reported were repeated. Captain Rogers, of the much worse and not likely to survive State Rangers, and four assistants attempted to disperse the crowd, but were fired upon, and Captain Rogers received a bullet in the left shoulder. The rangers returned the fire, killing Agapito Herrers, an ex-policeman, who was leading the rioters, and another Mexican, and wounding a woman, a sister of Herrera, who had fired at the officers from the window of a house nearby. Several other Mexicans were wounded, but the number cannot yet be ascertained, as they escaped in the crowd. Dozens of people report seeing wounded men, but how many saw the same ones is not The shooting was followed by a number of scattered shots.

At 11:45 a. m. a detachment of the Tenth (colored) cavalry, U. S. A., mounted and fully armed with 100 rounds of ammunition each, arrived at the market place. City Marshal Joseph Bartholome was sworn in as an officer, and under his direction the crowds were quickly dispersed. The leader of the first crowd encountered by the military undertook to talk instead of obeying orders to clear out and was promptly knocked down with the butt of a carbine and so badly hurt that he died within a short time after being carried away. His followers took the hint and rapidly fled.
