TWO DEAD AND FOUR MAY DIE. The Fire Originated From a Gasoline Stove Explosion, and Spread So Rap fdly That seven Women Were Forced

OMAHA'S FATAL FIRE.

to Jump Down Forty Feet. Omaha, March 22 .- Comparatively in significant in material destruction, but appalling in the harvest of death and suffering, was a fire that partially destrayed the Patterson block, at Seven teenth and Douglass streets, yesterday

afternoon. Two of its victims have al-ready passed away, four more are not expected to live, and about 25 others are suffering from broken limbs and burned and lacerated flesh. The dead are Mrs. Thomas Taylor and Mrs. Anna Schamel while Marguerite Holt, Mrs. A. A. Smith, Mrs. Ed Schiner and Fireman Will Guider will probably die from their injuries. With the exception of Fireman Guider all the victims are women or children.

The blaze started shortly after 3 o'clock. A group of women, busy with the affairs of the accret orders with which they were affiliated, were in a mo ment brought face to face with death. Sixty seconds fater seven of them lay burned and bleeding on the pavements, to which they had dropped 40 feet below. and the others were rescued after they had been more or less severely injured in their desperate dash down the single flight of stairs that led to safety.


The fire originated from a gasoline stove explosion in the rear of the third floor of the building, and next to the elevator shaft. It was not discovered until it had spread to the adjoining apartments and the entire floor was filled with smoke and flame. About 20 members of the women's lodge of Maccabees were attending a committee meet ing in the front meeting room on the same floor. They were unconscious of danger until a janitor threw open the danger until a januar likew open the door and told them to get our before the flames cut them off. The warning came too late. The fire swept through the door and down the single stairway. Those nearest the door fled through the blinding smoke and reached the street with hands and faces burned and blis-tered. They rushed panic stricken to the windows, through which the smoke was already pouring. The fire, scarcely a foot behind them, caught their clothing and scorched their faces. 


