Workers in Windsor Hotel Ruins Unearth Three More Bodies. THIRTY-SEVEN STILL MISSING.

> Of These Seventeen Were Employes of the Hotel, seven Were Guests and the Others Supposed to Be Visitors Who Were Viewing the Parade.

New York. Murch 23 .- What are supposed to be the remains of three bodies were taken out of the Windsor hotel mins at a late hour last night. These three brings the list of known dead to 18. There are still 37 persons missing. Of these 17 were employes of the hotel, seven were guests and the balance visitors who were there to view the St. Patrick's day parade.

The first find was made near the corner of Fifth avenue and Forty-sixth street. The workmen uncovered the remains of a body, consisting of a number of charred bones. Portions of a heavy silk skirt and some bendwork found with the skirt and some begawark found with the hones gave the impression that the body was that of a woman. Subsequently portions of what are believed by the police to be two bodies were found near the elevator shuft. Nothing was found to identify them. Those who examined the remains thought they were the remains of an adult and a boy, the latter being possibly the elevator boy, Warren Guion, who is among the missing. The remains have been taken to the morgue. Shortly after 6 o'clock last night a fragment of charred fieth was found on the Fifth avenue side of the ruins, near where other bodies were found.

The fire department still has its lines about the ruins, isolating a considerable section of one of the busiest parts of the city. A force of about 250 men was employed throughout the af-ternoon, and a new shift of the same number was put on at night.


Another Probable Victim, Buffalo, March 23.--A bank book found

By Exploding Smokeless Powder at Dupout's Pennsgrove Works.

SHOCK FELT FOR MILES AROUND.

The Cause of the Accident, Which Originated in One of the Drying Rooms, Has Not Been Determined. Two of the Dead Leave Families,

Pennsgrove, N. J., March 23.-Over 3,000 pounds of smokeless powder ex-ploded yesterday at the E. I. Dupout powder world at Carney's Point, near powder works at Carney's Point, near here, and appasite Wilmington, Del., Instantly killing three workmen and in-juring a number of others slightly. The dead are: Lenge Layton, aged 50, mar-ried; William Ford, aged 10, married, and John Mazill, aged 30, single. The bodies of the dead were blackened and disfigured by the explosion. The emuse of the accident has not been determined, but it originated in one of the drying houses, where Layton was

the drying houses, where Layton was at work, about 1 o'clock. The shock from this explosion shock the country for miles around, and in this town heavy panes of glass were broken in many houses. Across the Delaware river, in Wilmington, the noise of the explosion was also heard. Immediately following the first explosion came several other distinct and nearly as loud explosions, in small storehouses. Both the drying house and the storehouses were denot ished, and other small buildings about the works were damaged. Francis G. Dupont and his nephew were at work in the laboratory at the time of the exploalon and were slightly injured by pieces of glass, but personally directed the care of other injured and the recovery of the


