



ONWARD TO MALALOS.

Our Troops Are Marching on the Filipinos' Capital.

A GREAT BATTLE ANTICIPATED.

An Unconfirmed Disputch to a New York Newspaper Tells of Fighting in Which a Hundred Americans and Two Hundred Filipinos Were Killed.

Manila, March 25.-The long expected movement for the capture of Mulolos, the rebel capital, began at daybrenk yesterday morning. For two days there has been a loll in the fighting, and the sitions of the troops have been readjusted preparatory to this stroke which is expected to reduce Againaldo to the last extremity.

The first troops to move were the men in the brigade of General Otis, who struck tents shortly before sunrise. Immediately the word was passed along the line, and the troops became convinced that the greatest battle since the opening of hostilities with the Filipinos was at

General Oris occupied the position at Calcacan, which is nearest Malolos, on the road from Manila. His brigade in-cludes the Twentieth Kansas, First Montana, First Idaho, First California and

the Wyoming battery.

The first movement of troops under General Otis was met with a stubborn resistance by the Filipinos, and in the opening skirmish Sergeant Marris Cohen and Private John Muhe, of the Twen-tieth Kansas volunteers, were killed. The Second Oregon and Twenty-second infantry of the troops of General Wheston's brigade are concentrating Caloocan, in the rear of Genera

Otls' front. Third infantry joined General Wheaton's command yesterday after-

The cruiser Baltimore is going to Bollo to strengthen our forces.

Two Spanish prisoners who have escaped from Pole to the lines of the Kansas regiment report that the Filipinos have concentrated their forces at Mala-bon and Polo. They add that only Aguinaldo's body guard is at Malales and that the rebel leaders apparently in tend to stake their fortunes on a fight at Malabon. If defeated, it is further erted, the rebels intend to disperse to the swamps and mountains. The rebels were putting their Bolos in front, believ-ing that the Bolomen's charms will avert the bullets. The Bolos of the Filipinos greatly outnumber the rifles in their hands. The rebels are further said to have admitted that they could not stand the American shells and bayonet charges.
The escaped Spaniards corroborated the stories told of food shortage among

the rebels, and they added that their ospitals are short of supplies, The food supplies sent from the United States, including all kinds of vegetables, arrive in good condition. There is no complaint among the troops. 
